<u>Program: Ridge Meadows RCMP Crime Prevention Unit (CPU) in</u> Maple Ridge



The CPU is responsible for the organization, coordination, and deployment of community policing programs within the cities of Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows.

Speakers:

Allision MacRae is the Supervisor/Coordinator of the CPU and its programs. She is employed by the City of Maple Ridge, but provides and oversees the various aspects of this program which works in support of the RCMP Community Policing Unit. She also recruits and motivates volunteers, and organizes and implements a number of the crime prevention programs. (And last, but not least, she is the daughter of Debbie and Fraser MacRae.)

Diane Stevenson has been a volunteer with the program since 2004, being one of the longest-serving volunteers for the CPU helping our community.



Allison and Diane reviewed the various programs within the CPU, which include the following:

Speed/Cell Watch — an educational program aimed at reducing speeding of vehicles in high crash/ high risk locations; and reminding pedestrians and drivers to "leave your cell phones alone" and watch where you are walking (into or in front of). The program is conducted in partnership with the RCMP, Crime Prevention Unit volunteers and ICBC.



Bike Patrol - volunteers, who are often out on duty until 11 PM, ride through crime hotspots in order to act as a visual deterrent and a second set of "eyes and ears" for the RCMP.

Citizens on Patrol - a volunteer program where trained volunteers drive/walk through crime hotspots acting as a visual deterrent and report suspicious criminal and nuisance activity.



Lock Out Auto Crime – is an educational program, supported by ICBC, designed to draw attention to the high rate of thefts from vehicles

ISAT - which stands for *Integrated Safety Ambassador Team* - a volunteer program that integrates multiple community stakeholders, and focuses on community engagement.

Block Watch - a crime prevention program, which is based on a partnership between the police and members of the community who work together to prevent crime in their neighbourhood.



Business Watch – is a free program designed to reduce crime in the Downtown Maple Ridge Business community through communication and prevention measures. It involves a partnership between the city, the RCMP and the Downtown Maple Ridge Business Improvement Association (BIA).

Crime Free Multi-Housing - is a solution oriented crime prevention initiative designed specifically to help apartment owners, managers, residents, police, and other agencies work together to keep a legal and nuisance activity off rental property.

Community Events - the CPU and its volunteers participate in a number of community events, across both the cities of Pitt Meadows and Maple Ridge throughout the year.

Crime Prevention Statistics for 2022:

CPU had 55 active volunteers (prior to Covid, they had up to 1200).

They had 446 volunteer deployments, and 2024 volunteer hours total 2024 (citizens on patrol: 31, Bike Patrol: 101, ISAT: 338, Community Events: 558, and Speed/Cell Watch: 785).


Happy and Sad dollars included:
