Program: Katerina Pogrebinsky

Katerina is a French Language Teacher with 20+ years of experience and who currently teaches at Garibaldi Secondary School where she has worked since August, 2018. Prior to that, she taught at Meadow Ridge School from 2006 until she joined the staff



at Garibaldi. Prior teaching positions in BC included Archbishop Carney Secondary school and BC Christian Academy, and she was an ESL teacher in Kharkov, Ukraine. She has a Master's Degree (Curriculum and Instruction with Honors) at UBC (1998 – 2002), and a master's degree in languages at the Kharkov University. She speaks Russian, Ukranian, French and English.

Although Katerina is not currently a Rotarian, she got introduced to Rotary in the early 1990s when she was approached to start a Rotary club in Ukraine, and was instrumental in helping to establish Rotary clubs in her country after attending a Rotary convention in the city of Nice in France. When she moved to Canada in 1996, she joined a Rotary Club in Vancouver. After leaving Rotary, she was involved in raising money to care for premature babies, resulting from the significant increase in premature births which occurred among children whose mothers were exposed to radiation as result of the Chernobyl disaster.

After Russia invaded Ukraine, Katerina met with Gordon and Mary Robson, who were on the Ridge Meadows Ukrainian Welcoming Committee to help Ukrainian Refugees in Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. As a teacher, she understood that language would be a barrier for adults and students, and Katerina became involved in offering English language's lessons with Ksenia Beliaeva, a Ukrainian refugee who moved to Maple Ridge and was a professor from the Kharkiv University and an ESL teacher in Ukraine. The Golden Ears United Church provided the location for free. The types of classes varied, for those who had no, or minimal, English and who needed to learn some basic language quickly, and evening classes for those who had some minimal level of English and who may already have a job during the day but needed to improve their communication skills.

Katerina said: "When the war started, I had a lot of relatives in Ukraine and it impacted me personally. My family decided to host for people who arrived in May, 2022. I reached out to the Welcoming Committee to ask how I can help because I speak the language and host people".

In an effort to offer continued support for Ukrainian refugees, they also recruited volunteers to babysit the children, while the mothers attended classes or had to attend doctor's offices or take care of other family business. Most of the refugees were women and children because the husbands had to stay behind in Ukraine to fight the war by the Russians against the Ukrainians.

Many Ukrainian refugees found it hard to sustain a life in Canada because of difficulties in obtaining housing and employment and many (roughly 50%) went back Ukraine or other cities in Europe, as there were too many barriers for them to stay here; and adjusting to life here without family support was very difficult.


All members are reminded to pay their dues by the end of July.
