He has led teams to attract, retain, or expand businesses in key sectors including value added energy, value-added agriculture, transportation and logistics, manufacturing, Aerospace/aviation, and defence and security industries, along with commercial, retail and tourism developments. He now sits as the co-vice chair of the Invest Vancouver Advisory Committee and the Vancouver Metro Region, and represents the interest of the City of Maple Ridge. He has recently joined the City of Maple Ridge as its Director of Economic Development.




Tyler's presentation showcased all that Maple Ridge has to offer, including the following information and statistics:


Maple Ridge has a population of 90,990 people, with a growth rate from 2016 to 2021 of 10.6%, and a year-over-year inflation rate in May 2023 of 6.4%. The household median income is \$20,000 <u>more</u> than the City of Vancouver. Maple Ridge also has 1,000 acres of new non-residential growth areas under review, and a new economic development and tourism strategy which focuses on non-residential, retail and hotel. Regional assets that support future growth include the fact that Maple Ridge is well-connected by road, rail, water, and air to the world. It has world-class amenities like Golden Ears Provincial Park which provides nature-based tourism opportunities. With 443 vehicle/tent campsites, the Park is one of the largest campgrounds in the province. The West Coast Express is the only commuter train in western Canada, and connects Maple Ridge to the Waterfront in Downtown Vancouver.

Maple Ridge currently has public post-secondary education and training institutions including: BCIT, Justice Institute of BC, Douglas College, Ridge Meadows College, and UBC. Private postsecondary education institutions include: Discovery Community College, IUOE Local 115, and Sprott Shaw College.

The median after-tax income as of 2020 in Maple Ridge was \$92,000, compared with \$76,000 in British Columbia as a whole. Vancouver is rated at \$79,500 and West Vancouver at \$90,000.



The graph below shows population by five-year age groups and gender in Maple Ridge as of 2021. Women are shown in orange and men in blue. As can be seen on the graph, persons between the ages of 30 and 65 make up the largest segment of the population, followed by persons under the age of 30, and with those 65 years and older making up the smallest segment.



The downtown centre of Maple Ridge currently has over 2,000,000 ft.² of commercial space, and mixed- use projects are being constructed. Building permits issued by the city are well over 500 annually. In 2014 - 2016 there were between 800 and 900 permits issued each year. In 2022 there were approximately 600 permits issued. There was a "building permit function review" completed in November 2022, which had one of its key objectives to reduce building permit processing times and provide excellent customer service.

Maple Ridge is a top film location in Metro Vancouver. In 2022, Maple Ridge had 108 productions with 316 shoot days. There was strong representation from all types of media products, including television, movie of the week, feature films, independent films and commercials. Maple Ridge is also a destination for tourism growth. Golden Ears Provincial Park has 1 million visitors per year. Maple Ridge Park had over 62,000 visitors per month in July and August, 2020. The upcoming BC Summer Games in 2024 is set to create a substantial economic impact on Maple Ridge.
