RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



The World Health Organization designates 10 October as World Mental Health Day, and with Rotary placing a special focus on mental health this year, I would like to help answer the question posed to me most often when I travel to meet members: How can my club get started?

There are some wonderful examples of Rotary members taking action already. In the Philippines, the Rotary Club of Tiaong-Hiyas held a 12-week health challenge for mothers in the community to promote some baseline health screenings and coaching on a healthier lifestyle.

By the end of the challenge, the mothers had a special bond and decided to form a Rotary Community Corps called Ilaw ng Tahanan ("one who lights up the home") with the goal of involving more mothers in health education and wellness support — and later youth services, teen pregnancy prevention, and help with unhealthy substance use. Almost a year later, the RCC is preparing to open its own health center where mothers can come for peer-to-peer support.

Another strong example is in Colorado. In the fall of 2021, a small group of stakeholders from the Rotary Club of Highlands Ranch formed the Rotary Clubs of Colorado Endowed Fellowship for Pediatric Mental Health, which enhances the ability of Children's Hospital Colorado to recruit and train pediatric psychiatry providers and allows the hospital network to make additional appointments. This increases access to mental health care for children and decreases provider shortages. Since then, the project has brought on new supporters and is now fully funded with a 500,000 endowment. Investment income from this endowment will support a fellow — a psychologist or psychiatrist — at Children's Hospital. A new fellow will be named every one to two years, beginning spring of 2024. Over time this will create a cohort to bolster the mental health workforce, treating kids from all 64 Colorado counties and neighboring states.

There are many more great mental health project stories on Rotary Showcase, and I invite you to share your experiences as you begin your own projects. Also, please reach out to mindhealth@rotary.org with any thoughts or ideas you would like to share about mental health in the Rotary world.

On 10 October, I will host a Facebook Live event when we will recognize World Mental Health Day and further explore how Rotary members can begin this journey. But I would like to leave you with one way every Rotary member can make a difference.

Right now, there is someone you know in the Rotary world — in your club, from a project you've worked on, in a Rotary Fellowship or Rotary Action Group — who could use a little more of your time and attention. Rotary is this great gift of global friendship, and that also means being there for each other.

Discovering the human connections that bind us is what we do through our membership every day. It's what Rotary has always been about, and we can build on it by helping each other find peace at home.

We need to learn how to ask not just "How are you?" but also "How are you really?" By doing so, Rotary can continue to *Create Hope in the World.*

Chili, Mangal and Mandip were three of the founding members of this prominent cricket club that was "established in 2021 for the purpose of fostering and promoting competitive cricket in the communities of Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. The MCC's mission is to provide a platform for local cricketers to support, train, coach, mentor and represent them in big competitions across BC and Canada.

They played two tournaments in 2022, and their long-term vision is to see a MCC player representing the Canadian national team. They currently play at Selvey Park, but are actively working with the City to secure a different location to establish a dedicated cricket pitch that allows them to play regularly on the weekends and weekday evenings."

Program: Cheque presentations to Duck Race participants



The **12**th **annual Rotary Duck Race**, that was put on by our club on August 13, 2023, was the most successful ever in terms of the amount of money that was raised for the communities of Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. In addition to donations from our generous sponsors, ticket sales amounted to almost \$92,000. Tickets were sold for \$10 each by the various community organizations, who received 80% of their ticket sales. The top seller was the Haney Neptune Aquatic Club who sold \$9,500 worth of tickets, followed by the 1st Haney Scout Group who sold \$8,090 worth of tickets.

Pauline Edington of the Ridge Meadows Hospital Auxiliary said that most of the \$2,800 which they earned from selling Duck Race tickets will be going to fund an annual bursary to help graduating high school students going into the field of health care. She also advised that the gift shop at the Hospital (which has been run by the Auxiliary for the last 75 years) has had to close shop due to the lack of enough volunteers to keep it operational.
