### LAST WEEK'S MEETING

As reported in the August 20, 2024 edition of this Four Way Flasher newsletter, the prizes won by those who purchased tickets for our **Rotary Duck Race** (that was held on August 11, 2024 at Maple Ridge Park) were given out at our Rotary meeting held on August 13, 2024.

## As reported in The News:

Thousands of yellow rubber ducks made their way along the Alouette River on Sunday, August 11, in a race to win a grand prize of \$15,000 and to raise much needed money for local community groups. About 9,000 tickets were purchased for the 13th annual Rotary Duck Race, raising money to support local youth and senior groups. Prizes were awarded for the first five ducks to cross the finish line. Grand prize winner was Jaycee Benson of Maple Ridge who took home \$15,000 cash.





Benson and his wife realized at the last minute they double booked the air show on the same day as the duck race and decided to head to Abbotsford because it was a full day event. "We were like, we'll go to the air show, we'll be there longer, and, you know, we're probably not going to win anyways, the duck race," he laughed. His neighbours, who were at the duck race, were the first to tell him of his big winnings.

"They just started messaging us saying, you guys won," he said. Benson and his wife purchased the winning ticket from their son, a member of the 1st Haney Scout Group, who was left with six extra tickets he was having trouble selling. So, Benson and his wife bought all of them, to help him out. "This is crazy. I've never really won anything, like, substantial. This is definitely the most I've ever won, for sure," he said.

Funds raised from the event are used to provide financial support to not-for-profit youth and senior organizations like: school Parent Advisory Councils, hockey teams, arts groups, dance groups, softball teams, in addition to Rotary youth and senior projects in the communities of Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows. Each community organization that sells tickets for the event receives 80 per cent of their club's ticket sales. Over \$90,000 worth of tickets were sold.
