Program: Simon Matthews: KEEPS

About Simon:

Simon is a recently retired security consultant who joined Keeps 15 years ago, and is now its chairman. He previously volunteered as a soccer coach, was involved with the Scouts, and did salmon surveys for the Alouette River Management Society. He has been the chairperson of KEEPS since 2022.

About KEEPS

KEEPS is a registered nonprofit volunteer society established in 1998, which

operates at Bell Irving Hatchery, located at 11430 - 256th St., Maple Ridge. The mission of the Society is to maintain the health of the Kanaka Creek watershed's natural ecosystem through education, community involvement, scientific research, land preservation, and partnerships based on stewardship principles.

The Society advises Metro Vancouver Regional Parks with an aim to maintain recreational opportunities in harmony with nature, and to promote public knowledge and stewardship of Kanaka Creek Regional Parks' natural environment.

The society also partners with Metro Vancouver Regional Parks in events and programming at the Kanaka Creek Watershed Stewardship Centre, which includes the Bell-Irving Hatchery, the George Ross Learning Room, and wetlands.

KEEPS develop Coho and Chum eggs which, when mature enough, are released into the creek. The informal education is at the hatchery and fish fence where people can come and view the sites, ask questions and learn all about the fish program. The formal education is done through the schools where classrooms can participate by having aquariums in the classrooms watching eggs develop. They presently have several things on the go and the most pressing is the upgrade required to the fish fence. Simon showed slides of the projects planned over the next few years. They include A frames to protect the tanks and new cement for some of the tank bottoms. Simon encouraged everyone to come and visit.

District Governor Dave Duskin's Message for November



I encourage all district Rotary members to join the District's PolioPlus Society by pledging a minimum of \$100 annually to the PolioPlus Fund of The Rotary Foundation (TRF) until polio is eradicated worldwide. This month is Foundation Month, so my message is to give annually to the TRF's Annual Fund and the PolioPlus Fund.

The Foundation funds many humanitarian projects in addition to its efforts to eradicate diseases like polio, such as promoting peace, fighting disease, providing clean water, supporting education, and growing local economies. Contributions enable these global initiatives, amplifying Rotary's reach and influence in our seven focus areas.

This year, the District has chosen not to have a Foundation Dinner. The thought is that the meal cost has grown significantly, and the money would be better spent giving it to TRF. Our Foundation Committee chair, a past trustee of TRF Dean Rohrs, is working on other ideas to promote the foundation and to recognize clubs and individuals for their support.

"Every Rotarian, Every Year" (EREY) is an initiative by TRF that encourages each Rotary member to contribute yearly to TRF's Annual Fund and participate in at least one Rotary service project annually. The program aims to have every member contribute each year to support projects that align with Rotary's mission. Each club is encouraged to become 100% EREY.

Through EREY, The Rotary Foundation seeks to ensure consistent funding for its global and community-based projects. It also underscores the idea that when every member contributes, regardless of the amount, Rotary's collective impact can be significant in addressing critical needs worldwide.

An annual gift to the PolioPlus Fund does not qualify for EREY, as it must be a gift to the Annual Fund. Making an annual gift online is very simple. If you have not done so, go to Rotary.org and create a MyRotary account. A "donate button" will walk you through the process.
