Program: Disbursement of Duck Race Cheques

The following Article about the cheque presentations at our club meeting was published in the <u>Maple Ridge - Pitt Meadows News</u> on September 24, 2027, as reported by Colleen Flanagan, with the headline:

Community groups receive rewards from Rotary Duck Race in Maple Ridge

Almost \$98,000 raised at the event in August

Community clubs/organizations picked up their cheques Tuesday afternoon, Sept. 23, for their efforts selling tickets for the 14th annual Rotary Duck Race.

A little shy of \$98,000 was raised at the event this year that saw hundreds of yellow, rubber ducks race along the Alouette River in Maple Ridge Park on Sunday, Aug. 10.



"Which is the most we've ever raised in our 14 years of Rotary Duck Race," said Ineke Boekhorst, with the Meadow Ridge Rotary Club.

One \$10 ticket bought one duck in the race and each club selling tickets would get \$8 of each ticket they sold back for their group.

1st Haney Scouts sold the most ducks in the race, raising \$10,320 for the club.

Club representative Jonathan Donaldson, who picked up the cheque at the weekly rotary club meeting at Meadow Gardens Golf Club, said the money will go to good use.

"It helps pay for our tents, it pays for the various supplies that we need from tarps to snowshoes, to stoves, to coolers, to all the gear that we need as a group to function," he said.



1st Pitt Meadows Scouts raised the second highest amount for their club, \$10,080.

Ridge Meadows Minor Softball raised \$7,032, the third highest amount.



Representative Kate Doucette said the money will help pay for equipment and keeping their facility up to date. She also noted the money will also go to covering registration for children whose families can't afford to pay.

The fourth highest amount was raised by the 1st Laity View Scouts, who received a cheque for \$5,656.



They will be using the money for fun activities from mountain climbing to canoeing, said their representative Jennifer Simm."And the biggest thing is we are going to use it towards our canoe trailer, it's falling apart," she said.
