



For those of you unable to attend, we had a wonderful evening at the Gourmet Hideaway installing the new Executive and giving out the Presidents awards. The new executive is ready to Rock this Rotary Centennial Year and President Mary showed lots of enthusiasm and passion for the task at hand.

Ready or not, here comes an exciting year in MeadowRidge Rotary and Mary cheerfully assured us "we will survive".

I think we may not only survive, but will also thrive with the level of commitment displayed by Mary.



OUT WITH THE OLD

All club members can take pride in our service to the community (both local and international) during the past Rotary year. The following is a brief summary of our accomplishments.

Community Service

We contributed \$5000 to poverty alleviation, including the Food Bank, Meals on Wheels, Cythera House and the Christmas Haven.

In support of the youth of our community (not including the projects funded by the Sports Banquet) we donated \$5000 to the Zajak Ranch, \$1000 to the Police canoe trip down the Fraser with First Nations' youth. \$6300 for high school



bursaries, \$250 bursary to a junior fireman, \$14,000 to fund the Youth Diversion Program in conjunction with the local RCMP, and \$1000 for the RCMP Youth Academy.

Other Community Services

We have committed \$2500 to a literacy program with the local library, given \$1000 to install the cork board along the wall of the Fraser Room in the library, paid \$1100 for the materials to install a ramp on the Women's Centre in Pitt Meadows, joined with Gordon Kirkland in providing funds to the Pacific Riding Association for the Disabled, and helped support community events such as the Agricultural Fair and others with donations of approximately \$2000. We contributed \$2500 for the construction of a bicycle path around the Pitt Meadows airport, now called the Rotary Route (you should take a bike trip on it!).

International Service

From our Golf Tournament, we raised \$3500 to complete our \$10,000 pledge to our Rotary Foundation to help with polio eradication. In addition, our individual club members donated in excess of \$3500 to our Rotary Foundation, with most members participating.

With the help of the Mission Sunrise Club and generous donations from friends of Dave Rempel, we sent \$9500 to Russia to buy much needed farm equipment for a school for troubled boys. We interviewed and selected an outgoing exchange student; and don't forget the visitation from our Russian Rotarians and friends from Novosibirsk, Siberia.

Vocational Service

In addition to our bursary program for high school students (which this year was raised from \$500 to \$1000 each for six bursaries, plus the Yves Duamel Memorial Bursary for music), we supported RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards), the Esteem Team to give inspirational talks to our youth in our local schools, and undertook a vocational services project by providing interviewers as well as financial assistance for the grade 10 career planning and interview pilot program at both Westview and Garibaldi Secondary schools. We donated \$500 to a local student nominated to attend the 2005 Global Young Leaders Conference in New York and Washington, D. C. And last but not least, we started a pilot project with Inner Visions Recovery Centre in Maple Ridge. (Hanna House is a drug rehabilitation center for women).

Club Service

We topped all the Rotary club's in Area C for increase in membership. We had the pleasure of welcoming 11 new members into our club (but have been sad to lose Dave Reekie, Lance Harris, Craig Vernon, Caro O'Kennedy and Livia Mior). We had some great programs, another great 50-50 draw to the second-to-last card, and tightened up our meetings thanks to our

three Sergeants-at-Arms. We enjoyed club socials at the home of Marco and Lila's, and Gordon and Mary's, and of course Vladimir and Zdenka's (bee farm).

We even stole the bell from the Mission Noonday Club under the noses of a retired judge and RCMP members.

Fund Raisers

We completed with smashing success are four major fund raisers, namely, our Golf tournament, the Sports Banquet, the Wine Zest and our participation in Bingo, which brought into our club for Community Service in excess of \$75,000 this year alone. From funds raised this year and previous years at the Sports Banquet for youth sports facilities, we have this year committed and/or paid \$25,000 to the Pitt Meadows Ice Arena (our Rotary logo in at center ice), \$50,000 to the artificial turf field at Samuel Robertson secondary, and \$17,000 (including a \$3200 matching grant from District 5050) for the Kanaka Creek Elementary School multi-sports court.

I am very proud of our Club and of the hard work and dedication of our Committee Chairpersons, and the Chairs of our fund raising events, and of each and every one of our club members who have given generously of their time and talents and sweat to make this a banner year.

Outgoing Presidents Remarks:
