#### LAST WEEK'S MEETING



This week we had the honour of having our visiting Exchange Student attend our meeting and present a banner from the Rotary club in Germany. Leonie Krekeler is currently staying at Doris Gagel's but by the time you read this will be at the Robsons and already have a "road trip" to the Glacier Park Lodge under her belt.

Our Sports Banquet has been moved to Tuesday October 5<sup>th</sup> again, and preparations are well under way. Of the possible 20 tables of 10 we have already reserved 7. Tickets are once again \$125 each.

Our Golf Tournie is also underway and Ineke is looking for those 2 bottles from everyone for our now "famous" Bottle Draw. Even if you are not golfing it is hoped everyone will participate in the bottle draw. For more details about the Golf Tournie please speak to either Kevin or Brian.

The Hospice Calendar is full speed ahead and we can expect to receive them by 15 September at which point the push is on to sell them all.

Our guest speaker this week was Pat Jacobsen, the CEO of Translink. Pat came to inform us that Translink is aware of our area and endeavouring to help us within the 10 year plan which she outlined. She indicated that we currently have 160,000 commuters every day out of Maple Ridge of which 80% use automobiles, and 4% are using transit (mostly West Coast Express). (I guess I fell asleep or something I'm not sure how the other 16% are travelling... perhaps by flying???) Anyway, Translink is trying to improve our situation on two fronts, one to make travelling by car more viable and secondly by offering viable & economical alternatives to the commuters.

In the Lower Mainland we currently have a population of approx 3 million and this is expected to grow by another million by 2031. There is also expected to be a 200% growth in container traffic and the Port is also increasing traffic. We have also seen 30% higher tourism in the last 10 years.

The planned "Golden Ears Bridge" is expected to have construction started in 2005 and completed by 2008. This will have a significant affect on our community. It will change traffic patterns and also open up more lands for residential and industrial use.

For anyone interested the final route for the Abernathy connector is set and a map is available on the Translink website.
