Hospice Update – We still have 1,300 calendars to sell, and sales are going very well. Marco has personally sold 100 and offers up the challenge to any Rotarian who thinks they can beat his sales. We also have timeslots at the Haney Place Mall on Nov 19th, 20th and 26 & 27th, If you have not signed up already but would like to please call Bob Shantz and he will set you up.

We gave a donation today to the Friends in Need Food Bank and they were very happy for it. They currently have 2,518 registered clients of which 51% are families and 37% are children. In order to register for a hamper participants must provide proof of address within Maple Ridge /Pitt Meadows, have a picture ID and proof of income. They also have many people who come by daily to pick up bread or cans of food. Another program is for people with babies in that they can come 12 times a year to pick up a baby hamper which includes things like diapers and baby food. The funds we donated will be used to "enhance the family hampers" with more high protein foods to be used in children's lunches for example.

We also installed another new member. Robert Campbell, the Theatre Director for the ACT has joined our ranks. Robert hails from Edmonton originally, where he grew up with his 4 brothers. He studied Jazz Piano in University and he worked in the entertainment field for many years. He came to BC in 1986 and later to Maple Ridge in 1992 the same year his 1st son was born. He also has a second career in Computer Technology. He looks forward to his Rotary Career with great enthusiasm.
