

About The Rotarian

The Rotarian addresses the personal and business interests of a selected audience involved in business or one of the professions. The chief purpose of *The Rotarian* is to report Rotary news and general subjects directed to the interests, loyalty, and involvement of its member audience. General articles cover such topics as business, travel, health, education, environment, management and ethics, sciences, sports and adventure. History

The first issue of *The National Rotarian* was published in January 1911. This 12-page tabloid was considered the best way to distribute an essay written by Rotary founder Paul Harris. The essay was titled, "Rational Rotarianism." There was also club news and advertisements. About 2,000 copies were produced by printer Harry Ruggles, one of the first members of the Rotary Club of Chicago. Soon the issue went back to press for another 2,000 copies. Seventeen Nobel Prize winners and 19 Pulitzer Prize winners have written for the magazine.

Subscribers

There are about 410,000 subscribers in the United States. Canada comes in second, with more than 30,000 subscribers. India is third, with about 10,000 subscribers. There are more than 4,800 subscribers in the Philippines, and 3,800 in Japan. In Nigeria, more than 3,000 club members subscribe to *The Rotarian*. In Australia, there are 1,900 subscribers, and almost 1,300 in New Zealand. In Finland, there are 1,000 subscribers, as well as 1,500 in Hong Kong and 700 in Indonesia. Of the total number of subscriptions, about 20,000 are to non-Rotarians. Most of these are gift subscriptions to schools, libraries, and individuals. The Rotary Club of Rockford, Illinois, USA, has been the world's gift-subscription champion for many years. The club annually sponsors about 250 gift subscriptions to *The Rotarian*. Annual subscription price of the magazine is US\$12.



LAST WEEKS MEETING

GORDY ROBSON gave us the Mayor's report about how things are going in Maple Ridge. He says that the staff is very competent and talented. As for the Council, they all want to work together. They have the most ambitious work program in the Municipality's history, and are very positive about achieving objectives.

OCP PROCESS has begun with 2 Visioning sessions with the public. People once opposed were sharing ideas and working together at the round table discussions. The discussions are productive. There were discussions about Business parks and Employment Zones as well as transportation. Area plans were discussed as were the Downtown core and Albion area and the Gravel Policy – things are moving in the right direction. It should be noted that Maple Ridge has been without an official community plan (O.C.P.) for 6-7 years now.



TRANSPORTATION: We got a direct line to SkyTrain with 22 stops!

GOOD NEWS about the West Coast Express coming up ! The express is funding itself at 70%, which is a super accomplishment and will be at 90% running both ways through the day. That is an efficient and economical system.

DOWNTOWN REVITILIZATION- There are now approximately 28 drug addicts homeless.

CASINO'S – The Municipality is examining the question of gaming in the community. Currently we have Bingo, Keno and On-line gambling. It is a matter of what kinds of gambling we have to choose from. The Mayor commented on the success of Langley's Casino which has a 60 room hotel as well as 1000 person conference center.

TAXI 'S – The Taxi companies have agreed to put rules in place.

METH TASK FORCE - Is again up and running.

METH SERVICE ON DEMAND – Is receiving 6-7 people from Salvation Army and 1-2 people from Alouette Addiction Services.

SHAW TV- Shaw cable is very supportive of our Meth project to show it region/province and Canada wide.

PROJECT TROLL- An employment generator which is expected to bring 500 jobs to Maple Ridge

SPORTS FIELDS – There are 3 new sports fields planned. Gordy hopes a softball city type facility and a Stadium will be built in Maple Ridge as well as a shooting range.

ECRA – The investments in ECRA have been sold and turned into cash for the City.

ALBION LANDS - No Wal-Mart is planned for the Albion Flats.

ENVIROMENTAL – There are ¹/₄ Million trees planted in Maple Ridge to create carbon credit and improve our air quality.

RELIGION – There is a need for a Sikh Temple in Maple Ridge,. St. Andrew's needs a roof and St. Patrick's needs sidewalks.

BLUE MOUNTAIN – Gordy says that Blue Mountain is in a disastrous state. He visited the site and found over 120 vehicles up at one time, tearing it up. This location is apparently the only place left that permits this activity. Gordy suggests we assume ownership of Blue Mountain and control it.

RECYCLING – We are recycling at a rate of 50% only. The Municipality is looking for new location to expand its and our participation.

SENIOR'S ZONE – In the senior's area near 224th, the traffic will be slowed down, the area will be well lit and look good for the Seniors.

MAYOR'S CLUB – There was an ex-Mayors summit in Maple Ridge. Six of the past Maple Ridge Mayor's were in attendance. A project begun in 1972 is actually underway now!

ALARM ISSUE - It has been decided that RCMP will respond to all home and business alarm calls. Just make sure they aren't false alarms because they will cost you !

HARRY POTTER PROJECT - coming soon to a Municipality near you.
