
THE ZAJAC RANCH FOR CHILDREN

September 24 is the Zajac Ranch Round-Up, which we are invited to attend.

The WineFest committee need some silent auction calls made. Laurie asked for assistance from the club members.

Our Guest Speaker was Rhian Pipprell, who is the Literacy Officer for District 5050. Rhian came to present a slide show and give us an update on the Guatemala Mobile Library project.

Rhian advised that our new Rotary Leader, William Boyd, has made literacy one of his goals for this upcoming year. She advised that there is a Literacy Award available for Clubs partaking in literacy projects.

She gave us a brief overview of the program that was established by Rigoberto Zamora of the Probogua Language School in Guatemala. The literacy rate is in Guatemala is 50%. The age of compulsory education is 7 – 14 years of age. 90% of the children leave school in the 5th grade. Education opportunities are limited by the lack of books, written material and



supplies. Rigoberto has focused his time on setting up the mobile library to improve the level of education in the rural areas of Guatemala, and to support the teachers and motive the children to attend school.

A matching grant was obtained to raise \$45,000. USD to purchase a second bus and stock it with books. The books are bought locally in Guatemala to provide employment, and books that are culturally suitable in the right language. These are textbooks, encyclopaedias and picture books.

The buses have been traveling to schools, town squares and villages throughout rural Guatemala. Storage boxes, designed to look like miniature buses, that hold 200 books have been dropped of at schools for their use.

The Minister of Education sent a letter of support for Rigoberto's program. He was also in attendance at the Inauguration. There were 200 people that attended the event which included a ribbon cutting ceremony and the blessing of the new bus. Former DG Harv Jubie was in attendance with Rhian and they were presented with a tiny wooden bus as a keepsake.

The program is in continuing need of support, and requires approximately \$11,000 USD per year to maintain the bus, hire a librarian and driver, and pay for the fuel. Rhian asked for our continued support.


