
ABOUT THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

LAST WEEKS MEETING

Our Guests were Caitlin Green, Glenda Williams, Jamie Sin, Errica An and our Guest Speaker Bill Neale. Rotarian Sandy Wakeling returned this week. It's great to have Sandy with us again.

Bill Neale, President of William R. Neale & Associates, which specializes in Business Development & Management in the Transportation & Communications sector, came to speak to us about the Pitt Meadows Airport. Mr. Neale has been the Manager of the airport since 2001.

He gave us a brief history of the airport beginning in 1916 when the airstrip was ran by the Aero Club of British Columbia. In 1963 the Federal Government expanded the facilities constructing a satellite facility to the Vancouver International Airport. It was built like a miniature version of the Vancouver facility.

1972 – 1973 the airport was the busiest in Canada with approximately 250,000 flights a year. Later the Boundary Bay Airport opened to the general public taking away some of the flights. The mid '80s recession resulted in the airport being used less and less as a training facility. New uses for some of the land was required resulting in land leases to Van Vloten Nurseries and others.

In 1998 the Crown transferred the airport to the Airport Society. Seven Directors, local businessmen, ran the airport without the assistance of a manager. Then the pilots tried to run the facilities themselves with volunteer committees, which over a period of time resulted in deteriorating infrastructure.

In 2001, Craig Richmond coerced Mr. Neale to get involved with the airport.

Bill has 30 years experience in the telecommunications industry and has been a pilot for over 30 years. Bill instigated a 15 year development plan to diversify the airport. As Vancouver International handles the large carriers and Abbotsford Airport handles the charters, the Pitt Meadows Airport is looking at the regional carrier niche.

Over 700 acres of land, land that would not be used for aviation, is being utilized to raise long term revenue for the airport. In late 2007 they will be developing land to link with the new bridge. The primary purpose of the airport will be for recreational aircraft. In the last four years, a half a million square feet of hanger space has been constructed.

"Driving Unlimited" the largest driver training facility in Canada has signed a contract for the north side of the airport. The company provides driver training for the RCMP, Justice Institute, BC Hydro, etc. They are developing a 10 acre parking lot which will generate \$250,000. - \$300,000. a year in revenue.

Transport Canada is installing a navigation system, and the airport will be providing regional scheduled service to Victoria, Prince George, Fort Nelson, Kelowna, Kamloops, Spokane, etc. By 2008 the airport will be a central hub for carriers such as Coast Mountain Air and Air Canada Jazz

They are also constructing a seaplane facility, which will provide scheduled service to Victoria and Nanaimo starting later this year. Within the next two years they are planning on constructing a restaurant on the river. There is also a light industrial park in the future plans. 2010 will see the airport as a hub for helicopters transporting VIPs, media, etc. to the Olympics.

Saturday August 19th is the Pitt Meadows Airport Day. This is a family event without cost to the public. Last year they had about 10,000 people out for the event.
