Our fellow Rotarian Hilton Haider passed away at the age of 55 in his residence on January 1, 2007 following a long battle with cancer. He is survived by his wife Lillian, daughter Rachelle, son Mike and brother Ervin.

Robert's father worked in construction and built their home on a riverbank and the house burned down a week later in 20 minutes and they lost everything.


Robert claims he had long hair at one point, however no pictures to prove it, so we have to take his word for it!
