ROTARY CLUB OF MEADOWRIDGE – WHO ARE WE?

MeadowRidge was chartered on November 19, 1989. We are a luncheon club with 41 members currently. Over the past year we have added ten new members and lost several members.

We have a number of fundraising events each year to support our programs. Our Harvest Wine Festival will be held September 15, 2007 and produces \$12-20,000.00 per year for Arts and Culture. This has become an established annual event that much of the community looks forward to.





Our Sports Banquet Hometown Heroes will be held this year October 16, 2007. This banquet is our premier fundraiser for the Club. It features world-class athletes from the NHL, NFL, JHL and other world-class competitors as guests; we honor our local men and women who have achieved that level of excellence. The banquet produces somewhere between \$27-40,000.00 a year and the project has

provided funding to facilitate the creation of additional sports facilities in our community. An all weather sports field at Samuel Robertson Technical is a Rotary field. A lacrosse box at Maple Ridge Senior Secondary is a Rotary lacrosse box. A second all weather field is being built and is near completion at Laity Secondary School. The Twin Rinks were concreted to facilitate floor hockey and there have been a host of other smaller projects that the funding from the Sports Banquet has provided for youth and sports facilities in our community. This has been a significant boon to youth and sports in the community.



Our Rotary/Hospice Calendar project provides a lottery calendar with the funds going to Hospice to fulfill our Club's \$100,000.00 commitment to Hospice in the community. A year ago the Hospice facility was opened and Hospice, which is another not-for-profit society, has had to furnish the facility at an approximate cost of \$350,000.00. Our funds have gone towards Hospice's needs in that regard.

There are a number of lesser projects, which support Rotary. Our member, Vladimir Cukor's Bee BBQ at his bee farm provides \$2-3,000.00 per year, which funds go directly to Rotary International.



The Italian Serrata provides \$5-10,000.00 per year for the Ridge Meadows Hospital Foundation for medical equipment. It is a dinner provided by La Trattoria Restaurant at their cost with all of the funds going for the Foundation's needs.

We normally have a Youth Diversion Dinner that is sponsored by Paul Prokop, our host for our luncheon club with Rotary, which funds supports the Court Program to divert young offenders from the court process. This dinner has provided funds anywhere between \$5-25,000.00 on a yearly basis to support that program.

MeadowRidge Rotary is a dedicated group seeking to do good wherever and whenever possible.
