GOOGLE GIVES ROTARY US\$3.5 MILLION TO HELP END POLIO

Rotary International has received a US\$3.5 million challenge grant from the Google Foundation, a non-profit managed by Google.org, in support of Rotary's top goal to eradicate polio worldwide. Rotary will raise funds to match the Google Foundation grant dollar-for-dollar over one year.

The grant and matching funds will directly support polio immunization activities carried out by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), a partnership spearheaded by the World Health Organization, Rotary International, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Mary introduced our Guest Speaker Gary Slavin, President of the Ridge Meadows Minor Ball Hockey Association. Mr. Slavin advised that ball hockey for youth has been in our community for 6 years. Registration has increased during that period from 137 youth to 920 youth, ages 3 -19 years old.

The game has a 3 month season – April thru end of June. Due to the timeframe and current availability of facilities, there are 70 kids on the waitlist at this time



The rink board purchase, which cost over \$100,000, has allowed evening and weekend play. The ball hockey families are very involved and committed to the program. The parents put up the monies themselves to allow the program to continue. The regulations require the game to be played on a dry floor arena only. Parents pay for the team uniforms and other costs pertinent to the game.

There are a number of fundraising programs that have been developed to help with funding for facilities and costs for players to attend Rep Games. The programs include "Donate a Board" – which provides the donor with a recognition plaque at the Golden Ears Winter Club. Rink Board advertising which provides 10 advertising spots for sponsors. There are advertising opportunities also available in the game programs.

The Ridge Meadows Minor Ball Hockey started the Rep Program to have something to compete in. Gary has been chosen to coach ball hockey in Europe this year.

Gordy advised that the Ball Hockey Association will be applying for some funding from the Sports Banquet Committee this year. Parents in our community are very supportive of youth sports, especially this group who have attended our Banquet in the past. It is extremely important to have activities available for youth in our community to keep them out of trouble and active.

Dick Drew ended the meeting by reminding us of the importance of the ShelterBox event this weekend and asked that we ensure the tent is manned at all times.

-30 degrees, covered in snow, wet and homeless in Afghanistan...



February 15th - Kabul:

ShelterBox's experienced SRT member & photo-journalist, Mark Pearson, has been making an intrepid expedition over the last two days to the worst effected area of Western Afghanistan. On his arrival to Kabul earlier in the week he met with ACTED & Rotary who described the snowfall was the worst in 60 years with many fatalities. He met many of the displaced families from the Helmand Province gathered in the city with no shelter, their clothes were wet, children had no shoes and were looking unwell in temperatures Mark could only describe as a "Baltic freezer" he added

"there is always so much more to do in the regions but with these terrible weather conditions even the city is affected." Local people were helping with what little they had. ShelterBox HQ is actively packing up vital aid of tents and warmth to be sent over the next few days. Additional SRT members will join Mark in-field with the army to make further assessments.
