Our first Guest Speaker was Betty Levens on behalf of the local annual Terry Fox Run fundraiser. She gave a presentation called "Figures & Facts":

Betty thanked us for the monies donated annually to install the banner for the run, and asked if anyone wished to pledge for this year's run. The pledge sheet was then circulated and Betty thanked us again.

Betty Levens reported, that the 2008 Ridge Meadows Terry Fox Run, raised a total of \$29,165.45 This is the most ever raised in the Ridge Meadows area.

Thanks again to all our Meadow Ridge Rotarians, who donated last week after Betty's short presentation.



Our second Guest Speaker was Captain Ed Chui of the Salvation Army Caring Place Ministries. He advised that he and his wife, Kathy Chui, were privileged to have been able to attend the Salvation Army Camp located in Langdale, BC this summer. He explained that from May to September each year there are various camps held weekly to benefit underprivileged children.

He then handed over the podium to Connie McGonigal, Family & Community Ministries Advocate for the Salvation Army Caring Place. Connie explained that she has worked with the kids at Camp Sunrise for 11 years. She has had the opportunity to work with over 1,000 children, ages 2 - 18, that attend the camp for a one-week visit. The various camps include Teen camps, Music camps, Mums & Tots camps, and Holiday camps.

These camps are held to benefit underprivileged kids whose parents cannot afford to send them to summer camps. The camps provide a positive emotional experience, confidence and self-esteem, friendship and nutrition. Connie advised that there was a boy at the Camp who cried when he had to go home - this was the first time he had been fed 3 meals a day.

Five years ago the Caring Place's allotment was 18 children per summer. This year there were 28 from Maple Ridge who attended along with a waiting list. Unfortunately the program is running at a \$5,040 deficit, and more support is needed. Ed requested that we consider Camp Sunrise for future club funding. Ed and Connie thanked us for the opportunity to attend lunch and share their camp stories with us.

Ed, who is now the official chaplain for our local RCMP detachment, advised that Inspector Jim Wakely has been diagnosed with terminal cancer, and will be undergoing treatment over the next few months. He asked that we pray for Jim and his family.
