Our Guest Speaker today was Kevin Nosworthy who presented his "Who's Who".

Born on October 9, 1960 in Montreal, Kevin Francis John was the sixth child in the family. He had two brothers and three sisters.

When he was a 1½ years old, the family home burned down. His older sister, who was asleep at the time of the fire, was rescued by his Dad. They had no insurance on their home and lost everything. The family separated for a year while his Dad re-built. When Kevin was 10 years of age, his parents had a seventh child, a girl.

Kevin loved sports and joined a British friend to try out for soccer. Although he was an underage player, he became the leagues Most Valuable Player, and was called up for a try-out. Unfortunately, his professional career ended when he broke both ankles prior to the try-out. Over the years Kevin has broken his nose four times, both ankles, his palette playing football, right hand and five fingers on his left hand (just a bit of a klutz).

When Kevin was 18 years old his Dad was diagnosed with cancer. He gave Kevin a one way ticket to Vancouver to get started. After awhile in working in Vancouver, he transferred to Calgary. Later he returned to Montreal where he met Debbie through friends. They married and moved to Vancouver where Kevin found employment. On July 11, 1986 their daughter Samantha was born.

Kevin worked on inside sales for BC Tel Yellowpages. He had received a bonus from work when he got a call from the Province Newspaper about a billboard ad that Deb had ordered. Thinking she had spent the bonus money, Kevin was not a happy camper especially when a stretch limo arrived at their place to pick them up. He was convinced that she had spent all of his hard earned bonus until they arrived at the billboard which read "Kevin Nosworthy Will You Marry Me?" Deb had won a contest prize and wanted to surprise him.

Kevin worked in outside sales but left after 10 years as he was traveling 4 months of the year and wanted to be home with his family.

They purchased their first home in Maple Ridge, and in January 1998 Kevin started working for Mutual Life as a Financial Advisor. He became involved as a sales person in the Chamber of Commerce Group Insurance Program. Two years later he bought the business, which is now ranked no. 18 in over 100 Chamber Insurance programs in Canada.

With his love of sports, Kevin has coached minor hockey for 26 years. Debbie works with Kevin at Avanti Planning, and they still reside in Maple Ridge with their daughter and 3 dogs.
