Ken Paterson raised \$2,200 on his bike for Cancer ride. The event raised \$400,000.

Rotary Moment - 100% Attendance

Lynda told the story of a Rotary Governor who attended a meeting and met Dr. Doyle Dannenburg. He noticed that Dr. Dannenburg's name badge had a red sticker - 57. It was for 57 years of perfect attendance. Doyle started attending Rotary at the age of 17 when he was the local high school's student council president. After completing optometry medical school at the age of 23, the Rotarians followed up and he joined.

Our scheduled Guest Speaker, Cathy Scherer, had to cancel due to a case of H1N1. So the program was switched to a report on Sports Banquet funding. Gordy distributed a Banquet report as he explained that it was Marco's influence that original got the Robsons involved in Rotary. He was activated to raise funds for minor league sports. The role was to be a seed money generator for youth sports facilities.

Gordy explained the difficulty in obtaining silent auction items, and challenged club members to brainstorm t on different types of packages we could put together and auction off. He suggested we try for 10 high quality packages such as limo with overnight hotel accommodation a meal at a good restaurant, couples massage, etc.

Gord advised that we have some additional monies available as the Canoe Club project does not seem to be moving ahead. Still looking at funding the all weather turf field in Pitt Meadows. He explained that we've been approached by the Haney Club to work with them on funding the Loon Lake Field project which would be this year's project if approved by our members.

He asked that anyone interested in becoming involved with the Sports Banquet Committee step forward as we're trying to find new blood to carry on this event in the future. He reminded us that the purpose is to keep it simple, have fun and make us proud.

Haney Rotarian Rick Howard who is spearheading the Loon Lake project and Cheryl Power, Forester Malcolm Knapp Research Forrest gave a power point presentation on the project which will be named for Norm & Betty Pelton (Norm started his career at Loon Lake). They are seeking \$100,000 to improve the sports field at Loon Lake. It is a large field that will be used by the children attending Camp Goodtimes, an annual 5-7 week event for children age 6-16 that have been diagnosed with cancer.

Haney Rotary has committed to \$50,000, and are looking at three other potential funders - the Meadow Ridge Rotary Club, Maple Ridge Community Foundation and the Founders Cup Golf Tournament.

Cheryl Power provided some background information on Loon Lake. The original facilities were built in 1949 for use by the UBC Forestry school. It provided a location for field study and experiential learning, key elements of forest education. The facilities have been used by various university classes including conservation, architecture, and commerce. It is also used by high school and international students.



Their goals are to enhance programs, increase awareness and provide opportunities.

In 2003, UBC signed an agreement with the Canadian Cancer Society which designated Loon Lake as the permanent home of Camp Goodtimes.

Over the past five years they have completed the following work on the facilities:

1. Improved the trails,
2. Expanded the accommodation,
3. Built a dock,
4. Opened the Walter C. Koerner Forestry Centre,
5. Built an outdoor amphitheatre,
6. Replaced the cabins,
7. Undertaken the playing field and gate house construction.

Cheryl thanked us for the opportunity to speak with our club. Rick advised that on October 14th the Haney Club with be holding their weekly meeting at Loon Lake and they invited our Club to attend.

Gordy advised that the proposal will go to the Club Executive tomorrow and then back to the Club for endorsement within 2 weeks.
