Youth Adventures In Leadership

Friday, January 14 (5 pm) to Sunday, January 16, 2011 Camp Alexandra, White Rock, BC

Youth Adventures In Leadership is a program offered by Rotary International, the world's oldest service organization with over 1.2 million members in over 200 countries.

YAIL is open to the first 54 participants, in the 10th and 11th grades (ages 15 - 17). All costs are paid by the sponsoring Rotary club - there is no cost to participants.

Participating Rotary clubs range from Hope, BC to Everett, WA.

Youth Adventures in Leadership will give participants insight into some of the basics of what it means, and takes, to be a leader: to create a well-rounded individual with increased perspective and enthusiasm for growth, who is able to make informed decisions.

YAIL will teach participants through a variety of exercises involving leadership and growth - to empower students to network, plan, and set goals.

Participants will be divided into groups with an experienced youth facilitator. The program is led by youth, with guidance from adult Rotarians.

Candidates are selected and sponsored by a local Rotary Club, with a mix of males & females, Canadians & Americans. We typically have a broad range of personalities and many different types of leaders - coming from academics, sports, arts or other parts of the community. There are both verbal types and quiet ones who lead by their behaviour and by example.

There are also participants that don't believe they are leaders, but learn that they are and can be leaders.

Paul Nattall has a long tradition and history of staging winning promotions and events raising money for charity. Currently semi-retired from launching the Sunshine Coasts only local radio station, Paul brings an outstanding career in media marketing, sale and broadcast management to fundraising.

In 1988, as Director of Special Events for the Children's Hospital Foundation of Ottawa/Carleton, Paul launched the largest duck race in the world dumping 97,000 ducks into the Rideau Canal. This duck race went on year after year coming to an end in 2000 after raising almost 6 million dollars for the hospital foundation.

Paul was the President of Great Canadian Events providing racing ducks and turn key duck race programs for dozens of service clubs and charities across Canada, including the Rotary Club of North Vancouver before they suspended



their race in 2000. The Great Canadian Events company was put in mothballs in 2008. Paul continues to advise various charity groups on raising funds from events and will provide this extensive experience and knowhow to this project as required.

"Little Ducks make Big Bucks for Rotary"

Dozens of Rotary Clubs throughout North America have enlisted cute little rubber ducks to race and make big bucks to support the good work of each club.

Close to home, the Rotary Club of North Vancouver has been racing ducks for years and reaping the rewards of the money raised from ticket sales and wide community awareness of the projects they fund.

The ducks are on the move to Maple Ridge to work their magic next summer. It's time to get quacking on an event for the whole family that has the wings to keep flying and making money for Rotary year after year. . .. and it's a lot of fun too!
