- Restore amount of Annual Fund Giving, which had to been depleted over the last 3 years due to huge donations being directed towards Polio Plus. This goal had already been reached way beyond expectation.

The club was reminded of the District Conference to be held on May 5-8, 2011 at Harrison Hot Springs. The keynote speaker will be Jennifer Jones. In order to promote the theme of the Governors Ball , which was Mardi Grass, and in keeping with the RI convention in New Orleans, he put on a string of blue beads and encouraged all members to attend the conference.

He told the club that at the beginning of his year of office, he wanted to have a theme, which would be supportive and match with the official RI theme for the year. He chose the theme, "Be Your Best". He would use this slogan on pins for special members of clubs whose efforts needed to be recognised. This would be a way of encouraging members to be active in their clubs. He requested the presidents of each clubs to identify worthy recipients.
