Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is an exciting and challenging leadership training program for leaders, and 'potential' leaders, between the ages of 18 and 30.

Please note that the program will no longer accept applicants who are 17 or younger at the date of the program. Those students should be applying to attend YAIL or re-apply to participate in RYLA the following year when they are 18 or older.

Candidates have to be sponsored by a Rotary club. Often the participating clubs will contact young adults that they know personally, either at a local school, in the community, at work or at home. Family members of Rotarians can also participate. The cost to the club is \$375 per person until March 15 (increasing to \$395 after that date).

Annika spoke to us about the Hospital Foundation and the various things it is doing in our community. Since 1985 when it was formed, the Foundation has raised over \$24 million.

Our own Jim Coulter is a member of the board, and Laura Cherrille is the Foundation's chairman. Annika explained that the Foundation not only raises money to buy much-needed equipment for our local facility, but also supports research and partnerships with community organizations by funding their programs which are beneficial to the community at large.

By buying specialized equipment and by donating funds which make special facilities within the hospital possible (such as the Pediatric Observation Unit which was newly opened the day before our meeting) the Foundation not only makes sure that the doctors and nurses have the right stuff which they need to do their job, but also, by so doing, helps attract new doctors and nurses to the Maple Ridge Hospital.
