Speaker - Dictionary 4 Life Project



Our guest speaker was Russ McMurchie, who is the District 5050's new Literacy Chair.

Russ joined the Rotary Club of Port Coquitlam Centennial in February 2006, and has the distinction of having 100% attendance since joining Rotary. Despite only retiring as an Insurance Broker a year ago, he has been a very active member. For his first six years, he was the Weekly Bulletin Editor, held various Chairs,

then Vice President, the 2010 President, and is now back being the Vice President this year for another run at the top of the job in 2016/2017.

Russ's topic was the **Dictionary 4 Life Project**. These colourful and illustrated dictionaries started out as a project from a Rotary Club in England which continues to cover a portion of the book's cost.
