Clint Callison said that the **New Year's Gala** is set to go at the Meadow Gardens Golf Club, with tickets for the evening at \$95. There is a maximum of 300 tickets which are on sale now.

Our guest speaker was John McCormack who gave us an



informative talk and slide show to introduce us to **RESTOR International Inc.**

John is a long-time Rotarian, and currently a member of the Rotary Club of Kelowna (1982 to present).

He graduated from UBC in 1970 and obtained his CA in Kelowna in 1975. He was a partner in a Kelowna CA firm from 1982 to 2005, when that firm merged with MNP. He retired from MNP in 2012 but stayed on as a training facilitator to the present date.

John was heavily involved in the creation of **RESTOR International**, and inspired us with his story of what a few



Rotarians and associates can do to make the world a better place. He advised us as follows: RESTOR International (formerly Rotaplast Canada) is an all Canadian Rotarian non-profit humanitarian organization that provides free reconstructive surgery to disadvantaged children and adults in developing countries with cleft lip and palate anomalies, burn contractures and other disfiguring and disabling conditions. With the support of the Canadian medical and non-medical volunteers and the generous support of Rotarians, Rotary clubs, and individual donors, we work to build local healthcare in the countries where we work, and provide financial and volunteer support or facilitation for missions to the Philippines, India, China, Chile, Vietnam and Ethiopia.

We have evolved from providing strictly cleft palate surgeries and burn contracture repairs, to now responding directly to local healthcare needs including other disfiguring and disabling conditions. Our missions include full surgical teams who are able to address these needs, as well as provide medical training on the ground in the countries where we work.

RESTOR =

Respond – Educate – Serve – Transform - Operation Rotary

Our 2014 Mission was sponsored in part by:

- Rotary District 5060 contributed \$30,000 and was matched 100% by the Rotary International Foundation.
- Contributions by Rotary clubs of the Okanagan and matched 50% by the Rotary International Foundation.
- \$87,000 contributed by the Rotary International Vocational Training Teams grant.
- RESTOR International Inc. contributed the balance.



Our 2014 Mission was to the Gamby Teaching General Hospital in Bahir Dar, Ethiopia, the results of which were that more than 200 patients came to see us. 144 patients were triaged and admitted, and 71 surgeries were performed, including 52 burn reconstructions, 12 cleft lip/palate reconstructions, and seven uterine prolapse repairs.

160 people attended five formal teaching sessions, and 110 training hours were spent informally with local doctors, nurses and students in the OR, post-op recovery and on the wards.

Burn rates in Africa are among the highest in the world. Children under five in Africa have almost 3 times the incidence of burn deaths than infants worldwide. Non-fatal burns are a

leading cause of disability and disfigurement. In order to perform more complicated burn surgeries, additional equipment is needed at the Gamby Hospital. The cost is \$21,700. Two of the six patients with complicated burn



contractures have now been operated on Addis Ababa.

RESTOR provides the opportunity for persons to assist on these Missions in a non-medical role, including such things as medical records keeper, patient transport and quartermaster.
