Our Program - Ineke and Peter's trip to the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, Georgia





Ineke and Peter Boekhorst drove their motorhome (actually, Peter did all the driving) to Atlanta, Georgia, for the 2017 Rotary International Convention, clocking 10,000 km for the return trip. They were two of the 45,000 people who attended the Convention, and it was the 14th convention that one or both of them have attended. The RV park where they stayed with approximately 80 other Rotary RV rigs (participating from as far away as Australia and England) was approximately 45 minutes from downtown Atlanta, Georgia, located in the beautiful RV park in Stone Mountain Park.

Ineke said that the convention was "amazing", including the breakout sessions. Two of the several sessions which they attended, included these topics: "successful Rotary meeting formats" and "teaching the four-way test to decrease bullying".

The Speakers were top-notch, and included **Ashton Kutcher**, who is the founder of Thorn: Digital Defenders of Children, and **Jack Nicklaus**, golf icon, philanthropist, and Rotary Ambassador for polio eradication. Other speakers included **James Quincey**, the CEO of the Coca-Cola Company, who spoke about the power of corporate partnerships to address the world's problems, Microsoft chair **Bill Gates**, and **Bob Corker** who is a United States Senator.





Key issues for the convention included the issue of human trafficking, which takes many forms, but includes forced labour

and sex slavery. Members learned about the difference that one person can make in combating modern slavery.

One thing that Ineke and Peter always enjoy was the "House of Friendship" where the participants find music, entertainment, food, Rotarians from all over the world, and interesting displays

about Rotary projects. In it was a large blackboard where Rotarians could write greetings from all over the world. (It was so filled up that Ineke had to crouch down on her knees to find a spot and wrote "Rotary Rocks! P&I District 5050".)





Peter and Ineke made a fashion statement by donning plastic gloves and hats and volunteered at the "Rise Against Hunger" booth, a project which they hope to bring to our District 5050. Ineke showed us a couple of the package which contain

highly nutritious, dehydrated meals comprised of rice, soy, vegetables and 23 essential vitamins and minerals. The packages cost \$.60 per package, with a minimum purchase order of 20,000 packages. Rotary members across the globe are committed to ending hunger. Rise Against Hunger's meal packaging program is closely aligned with Rotary's six areas of focus, including fighting disease, providing clean water, supporting education, saving mothers and children, and growing local economies. Since 2005, Rotary members and student Interact/Rotaract clubs have packaged over 30 million meals that have been distributed across the globe.

Impressive amounts of money were pledged by countries and world organizations to end polio. The Canadian Minister of Health pledged \$100 million Canadian, the European Commission \$60 million, USA \$233 million and India at \$154 million (the rest in US funds).

In addition to the convention, Ineke and Peter saw many interesting things during their travels, such as:

- Dr. Martin Luther King Historical Sites, Museum, church and his residence;
- The Grand Ole Opry in Nashville Tennessee;
- "Wall Drug" in a tiny town in South Dakota ("an interesting marketing experience");
- Mount Rushmore, in South Dakota and
- Old Faithful Geyser in Yellowstone National Park, in Wyoming







Ineke and Peter have already signed up for the **2018 Rotary International Convention in Toronto**. (Any Takers???) Although they are taking their motorhome again, Rotary members who do not have Peter's driving skills or a motorhome to demonstrate them, can always take a flight across Canada.
