New Bylaws:

Our revised Bylaws had been circulated to all members, and the revised Bylaws were unanimously adopted.

<u>International Committee</u>:

Ineke reported that she and Dave Rempel, of our Club's International Committee, had paid for one shelter box, and also had sent some money to Russia in support of the international project there. (Ineke and Dave travelled to Russia during her [second] year as our Club President.) The Committee also wishes to support again the ISEE Solutions Society in the amount of at least \$500.

ISEE Solutions is a grassroots society that focuses on projects in Uganda. Solutions. Two areas of support that ISEE offers are:

Sanitary kits & education

This makes and provides reusable sanitary kits to girls who would otherwise drop out of school because of the lack of sanitary napkins. 80% of Ugandan girls leave school once they get their period. ISEE Solutions provides girls with re-useable sanitary kits and education on reproductive health and safety. One kit is \$15 and lasts 3 years.

Mama Nguvu: empowering mothers

Mamas have benefited from the micro loan program to start a business to help them send their children and grandchildren to school. Businesses including water storage and sales, book making, sewing services and cooking/food service. Each project must be sustainable by generating ongoing income which will be reinvested to support future Mamas.


