#### Goals for District 5050:

- She wants to combine continuity with change to keep the club moving forward and changing with the times. She recommends a visioning program every 5 years. This is now a 2 part exercise. Phase 1 is data collection from a diverse group of the club and followed by a collation into a usable document to track progress.
- Enhance membership experiences through more fun!
  People are attracted to people who are having a good time. Most rotary clubs do bring in new members annually, but they also lose people. By having more fun, perhaps the exit will become a road less travelled.
- District help is available! RLI is now the Rotary <u>Learning</u> Institute. The mandate has changed slightly to include education as well as leadership. Two sessions are offered aimed first at new Rotarians to teach them all about Rotary.







The DG will help with developing Rotaractor/Intereactor clubs – many of these young adults go on to become great Rotarians. Doubling the number of Rotaractors to 500,000 is a goal of the RI president.



Rotary Foundation is looking to increase membership awareness and understanding of its function and use at the club level. It would be great to double the number of "Every Rotarian Every Year" clubs.

- The district is looking for interested people to take facilitator workshops and go on to assist clubs with visioning etc.
- The Foundation dinner this year will be in Bellingham and the speaker is a polio survivor. The district conference is in Washington again at a resort in Puyallup. Lots to do and hear including aboriginal art exhibits, Boeing tours, shopping etc.
