Fine Master:

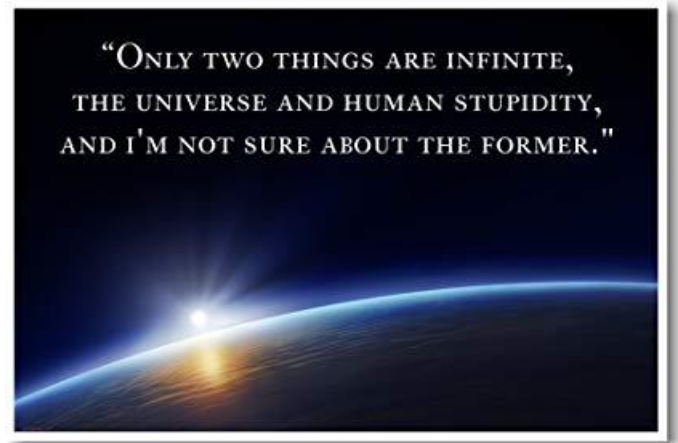
Matt DeBruyn fined all who had not presented a Rotary Bursary at a high school awards ceremony.
