

Happy and Sad dollars:

**Deborah Hyslop** is very happy just to be here. She said that last week she handed in her notice where she worked at Walmart (as she had accepted another employment opportunity) and an hour and 10 minutes later she felt chest pains and then shortly thereafter shoulder pains and shortness of breath. She went to the hospital in Maple Ridge, and after initially being told that she did not have a heart attack, was given an angiogram and sent by ambulance to the Royal Columbian Hospital. There she was diagnosed with Spontaneous Coronary Artery Dissection. [This is a tear in an artery wall in your heart that allows blood to build up in the space between the layers of your artery wall. This leads to a reduction or blockage of blood flow to your heart, which causes damage to your heart muscle and affects your heart rhythm. Reduced blood flow could cause a heart attack or cardiac arrest.] The doctor Royal Columbian said he could fix the problem and proceeded to do so. We are also very happy that Deborah is here with us after going through this close call.

**Ineke** attended with here daughter **Marjolein** and grandson **Jordan** at the Rotary Club of Kelowna Sunrise's Pancake Breakfast held at City Park in Kelowna on Saturday, July 18th. Apparently, over 650 children, youth and adults had no problem paying \$5 a full plate of pancakes, accompanied by a beverage. As a result, the club enjoyed a net profit of \$2500.

The fundraising event was held in conjunction with the Interior Savings Across the Lake Swim which had a record of 1188 swimmers, including 729 women and 459 men, participating in a challenging swim, which tested the ability and endurance over a length of 2.1 kilometres. The Cross the Lake Swim, started in 1949 and held for the 67th consecutive time, is the largest and longest running open swim event in Canada.

**Patrick Dobbyn** said his daughter came back from visiting her grandparents. (Apparently the one-way ticket used, that he told us about at a previous meeting didn't work).

**Matt DeBruyn** says we desperately need help for the Duck Race and Matt will be much happier if more volunteers would come forward. Our guest Bernard Bezuidenhout volunteered to help out.

## Rotary Duck Race event day:


Sunday August 11, 11 am – 2pm (actual Duck Race at 1pm)
