Speaker: **Karen McDermid** –Getting people with disabilities (PWD) into the workforce



Karen is a Maple Ridge resident and a past president of the Yaletown Rotary club. She is working for the ASTTBC which is the regulator/advocacy group for the technical service workers of BC. They are facing labour shortages as the economy grows whilst losing members to retirement. Since 1/7 of Canadians are listed as disabled, they are reaching out through research and training to attract this group to technical jobs.

For most, the abilities far outweigh the disability and many are ready and able to work, but need some help connecting with the jobs that are unfilled.



The Tech Ability Project:

Karen runs week long training workshops for PWD and then has them job shadow technicians to see where they could fit in. Several PWD have found work this way. Karen is looking for more PWDs for the next session as well as industry speakers and employers to provide the job shadowing.

The program is for participants anywhere in the lower mainland. A compass card and a gift card to Marks (for boots) are included in this free program.
