Guest Speaker: Jesse Sidu

Jesse gave us an update on his Financial Literacy Project.



He had previously talked to our Club about this project in January. As reported in our January 21, 2020 Newsletter (Vol. 26, Issue 28):

"Jesse Sidhu (with Lance Dinahan) spoke to us about the launch of a Financial Literacy Program which introduces financial concepts to high school students and young adults to prepare them for the real world. Jesse has been working on this idea for about 2 years now. The branding of the program will be under "Empower a Youth". The program

will primarily focus on FINANCIAL LITERACY, MONEY MATTERS as well as ENTREPRENEURSHIP".

Jesse gave us an update and advised that it is now 100% online and ready to go, to teach "kidpreneurs" about these various money matters.

Jesse also spoke to us about an <u>Online Auction Fundraiser</u> for the 6 Rotary Clubs in our Area D, which will also have a 50-50 drawing component. Clubs in our area will be invited to collect and put online various items for auction. The program to do this is ready to go, and Assistant Gov. Al is on board with this project.

The program has been certified by the gaming commission, and will be operated without much involvement from our club, except, of course, to provide auction items and to spread the news about the auction through social media, emails, and other means at our disposal.

It is estimated that the cost for each club will be approximately \$1,000. Our Board of Directors will discuss the matter and provide further information at the next meeting.
