<u>Speaker: Jackie Maclean, Clinical Hypnotherapist</u> (not a licensed physician or mental health provider).

About Jackie Maclean:

Jackie is certified by the International Medical and Dental Hypnotherapy Association (IMDHA) and the National Guild of Hypnotists (NGH). She was a former member and past



president of a Rotary club (twice receiving a Paul Harris Award), a board member of various non-profits, and earned her Distinguished Toastmaster accreditation. In the fall of 2011, she founded an award-winning program through which volunteers donated, prepared and distributed thousands of sandwiches to homeless people in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside.

Jackie McLean asked us if we would agree that many entrepreneurs are overworked, are under a lot of stress, and that many resort to alcohol, drugs or medication in order to cope with their stressful lives. She advised that she primarily works with business owners and entrepreneurs who struggle with substance abuse and other addictions, and that she is internationally known as the hypnosis practitioner. "My expertise using Hypnosis is about changing beliefs, shifting patterns, changing lives.

My clients quit their addiction to substances in a very short period of time. Over 90% of my clients guit smoking, stop drinking alcohol, quit pop, stop biting their nails, in one session." She explained that through hypnosis one is able to access the subconscious mind, and if a person is in a frame of mind to accept change, change will occur, and the person will let go of old beliefs and replace one behaviour for another. For example, if a person tries to stop a person from smoking by saying that smoking is bad for your health or cost a lot of money, that tactic will often not work because you are speaking to their conscious mind and not to the subconscious.

Matt DeBruyn noted that EndPlasticSoup is a global initiative which started in Amsterdam to solve the plastic problem by working with all the 1.2 million Rotarians to act to beat



plastic waste. EndPlasticSoup is already supported by 3,500 Rotarians of 800 Rotary & Rotaract Clubs worldwide. The website says:

Dear colleagues. Plastic waste in our environment is a major global problem.

Plastic, once warmly welcomed as a magnificent and extremely useful product, is becoming a threat for our planet: plastic waste ends up in our oceans, rivers, waters, beaches, forests, landfills and in our city parks and streets. Plastic does not disappear but just gets smaller and causes serious problems for living beings. And so it starts entering our food chain and our bodies.

I like to introduce to you EndPlasticSoup. EndPlasticSoup is an initiative of Rotary Clubs of Amsterdam (D1580), started in 2018. Within a year it has brought about great enthusiasm and a lot of activities amongst 60 Rotary and Rotaract Clubs in the Netherlands, in Germany and in Europe. EndPlasticSoup is creating awareness, setting up local actions, connecting Rotary internationally, across generations. Our goal is using our Rotary network to have a real impact and to help realize the required changes to prevent plastic waste ending in nature and to remove plastic from our environment. EndPlasticSoup is connecting Rotarians and other activists internationally, it offers a platform to existing organizations that are fighting plastic waste and opens up (local) initiatives all over the world.



You can start today. Use less plastic, use two pieces of plastic less a day and together with 1.2 million Rotarians (and family, friends) we will start reducing plastic waste! That's easy! Or pick up one piece of plastic waste everyday from the street, beach, riverside so it wont' end up in the lakes, seas and oceans. Tell your family, friends about the problem.... Ineke reported more good news. Some seniors at the Panorama Senior's building (at 12148 - 224 Street, which includes the Seniors Centre) raised \$3,400 to support this program.



Salvation Army News



Mark Stewart, Executive Director of the Salvation Army, Maple Ridge, updated us on their initiatives.

- 25 More bed spaces have been opened up in their building for existing clients.
- 2000 Bag lunch per week are being prepared and distributed by the Salvation Army in Maple Ridge, and the \$50,000 cost is coming from support from the community. Financial support for bag lunches is especially needed.
- They also give out 100 food hampers containing food with a value of between \$150 and \$200, as an interim measure to support those in need until they can register with the food bank.
- They have had ZERO cases of the COVID virus in their building.
- 50 Indigenous families have been helped with food.
