

Playground at Pitt Meadows Elementary School



Sherri Robinson, of the Parent Advisory Council of Pitt Meadows Elementary School (and legal partner of Adrienne and Eric), spoke

to us about the new playground equipment that was installed at this school, with a partial help of funds donated by our club.

Youth Firefighter Academy - Pitt Meadows Secondary



Scott Kyle, of the Pitt Meadows fire Department, spoke to us about the Youth Firefighter Academy which the Pitt Meadows fire department conducts to provide fire service training as part of the school's work experience program. Our club provides a bursary for this program, which this year was shared by two excellent participants, namely,

Jared Kyle and another student, Aidan (which means "Little Fire" and is of Irish origin). This program provides a unique opportunity for secondary school students to fulfill their work experience requirements. It is designed for students aged 16 to 18 years who are interested in firefighting as a possible future career. The students experience everything a firefighter would experience but in an encapsulated form, including instruction on personal protective equipment, basic firefighting skills, maintenance and upkeep of the Fire Hall, and equipment / firefighting apparatus along with CPR, first aid, fire prevention and public education. Scott said that over the years seven students, who attended the Pitt Meadows academy, have gone on to a career of firefighting in other fire departments.



Jared Kyle was one of four students who participated in this program. This year the program was compressed into two consecutive weeks, 8 AM to 4 PM each day, which required them to be off school. Jared described it as a great experience where all of the participants worked and learn together, and that he "would do it again in a

heartbeat". Jared also spoke highly of his participation in RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Assembly).

Program: End Plastic Soup





Wytzia de Savour, from the Amsterdam Rotary Club, was our special guest speaker (via Zoom) who spoke to us about their End Plastic Soup Initiative which started by the Amsterdam Rotarians to solve the plastic problem by working with all the 1.2 million Rotarians to act to beat plastic waste. EndPlasticSoup is already supported by 3,500 Rotarians of 800 Rotary & Rotaract Clubs worldwide. Their goal is that, "in 2050, there will be no more plastic soup in the oceans, seas, lakes and rivers Parks words the streets".

As it states on their website EndPlasticSoup.org:

You can start today. Use less plastic, use two pieces of plastic less a day and together with 1.2 million Rotarians (and family, friends) we will start reducing plastic waste! That's easy! Or pick up one piece of plastic waste everyday from the street, beach, riverside so it won't end up in the lakes, seas and oceans. Tell your family, friends and colleagues about the problem... Sign a petition (see website)"

More than one million plastic bottles are sold every minute in the world, and only 9% are recycled. There are five major "garbage patches" in the oceans of the world, two of which are in the Pacific Ocean and one in the Atlantic Ocean. The Great Pacific Garbage Patch (between Hawaii and California) covers a surface area three times the size of France, and is 5 metres deep. 1,000 Rivers in the world cause 80% of the plastic pollution.

Wytzia pointed out that 80% of the plastic used in the world ends up in the oceans. Rotary tackled polio, so, she asks, "why can't we do the same for plastic? With many Rotary clubs involved, we could have an impact, inspire young people, unite us in a common cause".
