
OUR CLUB LAST WEEK'S ZOOM MEETING:

Senior Link- Independent Living Society - Aid for El Salvador

Senior Link - Independent Living Society



Patricia said that 30% of seniors do not have family and community support. Therefore, Patricia brought together a group of dedicated seniors in 2002 form Senior Link Independent Living Society in Richmond as a non-profit society, whose mission and purposes are:

To reach out to isolated seniors to assist them to sustain their independence and wellness at their homes as well as to engage, promote and provide seniors with social, mental and physical simulation by opening avenues to participate, recognizing their talent and their valuable contribution to the community. Using the wisdom, skills and time of seniors, Senior Link quickly became more than just a society providing activities for isolated seniors, it became a network of valuable resources that will offer support in future on health-related issues. Senior Link provides a network for seniors, about seniors, as a voice to the community to showcase their activities, as well as to voice their concerns to representatives of Government, and ally with vulnerable seniors globally.

Aid for El Salvador - the Senior Link

El Salvador, a country located in Central America below Mexico, is currently facing massive destruction due to tropical storm **Amanda**, which struck on June 1, 2020 during the height of the Covid 19 crisis. The entire nation has been under strict military enforced quarantine/Stay-at-Home Order for more than 90 days, which implies people have not been allowed to work, freely access food and medication, and essentially having been at home starving.

Aid for El Salvador was created by the Senior Link with the purpose to provide help and relief to the families affected by such a tragedy.

Aid for El Salvador sent to El Salvador a container on July 6 containing food, bedding, and other emergency items. They are endeavouring to link up with a couple of Rotary clubs in El Salvador. They are also paired with a renowned local non-profit organization called Comandos de Salvamento el Salvador (meaning veteran Commandos of El Salvador who rescue people in distress) with decades of experience in areas of emergency medical service and urban search and rescue. This group will help to receive donations and deliver supplies to families in need. The Senior Link is planning to send another container on October 30. The cost of the container is only \$2,300. They are looking for donations of items that can be used to help the people of El Salvador get back on their own feet such as sewing machines, gloves, boots, tarps, ropes, tools, and housing and building materials, and the container itself will be used as a shelter for persons who have lost their homes.
