# OUR CLUB LAST WEEK'S ZOOM MEETING:

President Clint Callison opened the meeting.

Ineke informed us that Ken Knuttila has passed away. Ken was a charter member of the club and a very long time member of our larger community in Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows.

# <u>Program:</u> Morphine and Champagne – a harrowing tale of a personal health crisis.



Roger introduced our guest speaker, Ken Holland

Ken is a house designer and long time member of Rotary, holding a variety of senior positions.

Ken led several trips to the highlands of Guatemala where he and his youth teams delivered and installed wood burning stoves that

vented to the outside. Before the installation, the villagers breathed smoke from the fires with severe respiratory consequences. On his last trip, he was infected with some kind of pathogen which affected his heart valves. Over the next period of time, he lost up to 70 pounds, experienced delays, misdiagnoses, liver and kidney failure until he met a cardiovascular surgeon who was able to replace his valves. The improved cardiac function allowed his kidneys and liver to recover. There were periods of intense pain that the morphine helped manage and fortunately, did not lead to addiction in Ken's case.

The champagne was the celebration when he finally was healthy enough to enjoy this toast to health and hope. The birth of his grandchild coincided with his successful operation and was a driving force for Ken to live long enough to see the baby.



Ken's message to all of us is to advocate for our own health. He suggests we take a companion to important meetings with a doctor and consider a tape recording.

We are glad that Ken was able to survive and regain a good measure of health and thank him for sharing his story.
