Stan reminded everyone that our Nov 5 meeting will be a Membership draw, location to be announced, so get your thinking caps on for all those friends and aquaintances who you feel is a

good Rotarian just waiting to be ASKED to join our club.

Our guest speaker today was Charles Lester from Canadian Blood Services. This is the organization responsible for our blood supply in Canada for the past 4 years. The center in Vancouver services all of BC and the Yukon and we need 500 units per day to meet the requirements from our 90 hospitals. There are several permanent locations plus mobile clinics going into all areas around the province. In Maple Ridge we have a clinic set up at the Christian Reform Church on Dewdney Trunk Road, every other Friday. You must book appointments and they strive to get you in and out within an hour.

In the past we have been able to collect enough blood to meet our demands, however we are currently running below this level. It is imperative that we



increase the number of donors in order to continue to meet the minimum requirements. In Canada only 3% of the populations donates blood. The increase demand is due in part from increased surgeries and chemotherapy treatments as well as our aging population. Each donor can give blood every 56 days but Canada Blood Service is only asking that we each consider donating twice a year. One unit of blood can save 4 lives as the units are all spun down into platlets, plasma, red blood cells and whole blood.

In order to donate you must be between 17 and 71 and be in good health. If you get a tattoo you will be deferred for one year. If you are scheduled for surgery you can donate your own blood for any transfusions you may have to undergo.

Ineke suggested that we challenge other Rotary groups to donate blood. What do you think are you squeamish or can we do this. After all the life you save may be your own.
