

## Letter from RI President Bhichai

February 10, 2003

Dear District 5050 Rotarians,

I am writing to all my governors and club presidents in North America regarding my concern about the "Fulfilling Our Promise – Eradicate Polio" Campaign which has the goal of raising US\$80 million during this Rotary year 2002-2003.

Recent reports from the North American Fundraising Committee indicate great support from some clubs and districts. However with more than half the Rotary year passed less than 30% of the clubs in North America have submitted signed commitments to the Campaign Office in Evanston.

Polio eradication is a program of The Foundation of Rotary International that started with the grassroots of our organization and it is my sincere hope that the grassroots respond to this critical appeal favorably and wholeheartedly. Please, I ask every Rotarian in District 5050 to make a personal donation or three-year pledge of whatever amount with which they feel comfortable. After that each club should involve others in their community.

A simple four-point plan can be used to reach our goal:

- 1) Ask every member to make a personal cash contribution;
- 2) Consider a donation from the club's regular charitable fund raising activities during this special year. This should include the club's partners in service like Rotaract, Interact, Inner Wheel or Probus.
- 3) Organize a special "one time only" fund raising event that would allow non-Rotarians in your community to participate and contribute to polio eradication.
- 4) The Club President should sign the Club Commitment Form and fax to the campaign office at 847-328-4101 no later than 15 March 2003.

What is most important is that we act now so that Rotarians worldwide will be able to stand tall by the end of this Rotary year and say to the world that we have Fulfilled Our Promise. Please, I urge every club and every Rotarian to immediately make their commitment, in either cash or pledge, as soon as possible, but please not later than 31 March 2003.

Please act on my urgent request. The success of the campaign is what the Rotary world will remember about the 2002/2003 team.

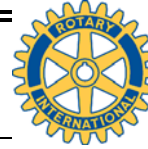

## BADGER DISASTER URGENT REQUEST

Hi D.G. Fred, as you all have heard Saturday morning brought devastation to the small town of Badger. This is a town of about 1200 people. When the flood started, people ran for their cars and pick-ups only to turn and run before reaching them in their own driveways, they saved nothing. Most of the people have been moved to Grand Falls-Windsor (my home town where I am a firefighter ) 28 km away. I have just finished a 20 hour shift of mutual aid monitoring the river. Most houses have some water in them, from a few inches to 12 feet. The temperature from Saturday to now has ranged from -25 to -15 C. All this water is now frozen, the people will not be able to move home until after the spring. Some houses have already shifted and tilted, the total damage will not be assessed until spring. It is always easy to get help just when

a disaster happens, but this event will last for the long-haul. Right now it's blankets, food, housing, and the human factor, counseling etc. The local SPCA has been overwhelmed with all the pets from Badger. There are so many areas of service that need to be addressed.

It would be fantastic if the district and the zone could get involved in this humanitarian request. The Rotary club of Grand Falls is asking If clubs could hold a small fundraiser to help this small town, it would be greatly appreciated. After 9/11 there was a book written about Newfoundland hospitality called "When The World Came To town", it would be nice if the world could come back again.
