The Mount Vernon/Skagit Rotary Club provides a number of scholarship opportunities to a cross sector of the community. The available scholarship awards are listed below. Each is subject to the rules and restrictions listed below.

SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

In Memory of Wallace Sigmar

The Skagit Valley College Scholarship is given each year to a Skagit County senior who exemplifies the qualities of a good citizen and dedicated student, and who is entering Skagit Valley College. This scholarship pays for tuition, fees and books for two (2) years at Skagit Valley College for the student to obtain an Associate's Degree.

Bernadette Roozen Scholarship

The Bernadette Roozen Scholarship will be awarded to a Skagit County female resident who attended Mount Vernon High School and who will be attending college in Washington State. The candidate will exemplify the leadership qualities of Bernadette Roozen.

Professional Technical / Vocational Scholarships

Scholarships are given to students who exemplify the qualities of a good citizen and show dedication to pursuing their education in the professional technical or vocational fields of study.

Skagit / Mount Vernon Rotary Memoriam University 4 Year Scholarships in Honor of Club Members

The Memoriam Scholarship is awarded to a student who exemplifies the ideals and standards of Rotary, and the qualities of late Skagit / Mount Vernon Rotary members. The scholarship award is for four years in an amount determined by the Club members.

College/University Scholarships

If additional scholarship funding is available, the club may decide on discretionary scholarships to Skagit County students entering either a college or university.



THE SKAGIT / MOUNT VERNON ROTARY SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND INFORMATION

In order to be considered, you must complete and mail the Application Form, together with any additional materials requested, including your high school transcript to the address shown on page 1.

The applicant must be:

- 1. A freshman entering a university (or first year student entering a technical or vocational program) in the year in which the application is made;
- 2. A Skagit County resident; and
- 3. *For college and university scholarships applicants:* A graduate from a Skagit County high school with a cumulative grade point average of at least **3.0** for all college and university scholarships.

For technical or vocational program applicants: A graduate from a Skagit County high school, or recipient of a G.E.D., with a cumulative grade point average of at least a **2.5*** for the technical or vocational program applicants.

*Technical and vocational program applicants grade point averages will be reviewed on a case by case basis and those with less than a 2.5 grade point average may be considered based upon extraordinary circumstances of the applicant.

The recipients will be selected by the Board of Directors of the Mount Vernon/Skagit Rotary Charitable Association and decisions of the Board will be final. The scholarships are merit-based scholarships however the Mount Vernon/Skagit Rotary reserves the right to consider an applicant's need and any other factors in determining the recipients.

Tuition payments will be made directly to the college. Payments for the second years will be made only upon receipt of his or her first year official transcript demonstrating compliance with the grade point and course load requirements. College and university scholarship recipients of consecutive year awards must maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 while taking a minimum of 10 credits per quarter. The Wallace Sigmar Scholarship includes tuition and an allowance for books of not more than \$250 per quarter. The reimbursement for books will be made on the "honor system" based upon the actual cost of required books and materials as reported by the recipient to the Board of Directors.

Tuition payments will be made directly to the college or educational program. <u>Payments for subsequent years will be made</u> only upon receipt of the student's first year official transcript demonstrating compliance with the grade point and course load requirements. *Scholarships must be utilized within 12 months from date of award*.

DEADLINE: APRIL 1st OF THE YEAR OF APPLICATION All materials must be postmarked or electronically delivered by April 1
