

Johann Berger who is a member of the Rotary Club of Munich gave a presentation to us on the differences between his club and our club. The presentation was not to compare them to us but to show how different Rotary clubs can be from each other.

RC Munich has 96 members that provide nearly \$25,000 in annual dues and about \$150,000 in annual donations. All the members are either academics or leaders of big businesses and there are no women

permitted in their club. The club itself is run by a hired assistant.

They do not carry out hands-on projects but support financially six large projects — PolioPlus, an orphanage in Kampala (Uganda), Swimming Doctors (medical boats working in the Myanmar Delta), a Child Youth Centre in Munich for children with special needs, a program where students tutor other students and a program called Textile where refugees are taught sewing by a master tailor.

As a club RC Munich does not do a lot of socializing with each other but they do some events such as an Octoberfest evening or an Installation evening.

It was a very interesting presentation and as Johann pointed out there is no way to compare our two clubs other than we both strive to carry out Rotary's avenues of service and provide "service above self".






