



Our guest speaker this evening was Lisanne Ballantyne, President and CEO of Tourism Kelowna. Lisanne explained to us what Tourism Kelowna is and isn't. To start with they are not part of the City of Kelowna staff but receive their funding from the local market and provincial funding collected through the hotel taxes. Kelowna Tourism is not a collection of only the bigger tour operators in Kelowna. All tourism businesses and organizations in the Kelowna area are automatically stakeholders with Tourism Kelowna without paying a membership fee.

Currently the Kelowna area sees 2 million visitors per year and that is expected to rise to 3 million visitors by 2021. To handle this workload, they do not have a large staff, but get by with 12 to 14 full time staff, 60 visitor service staff (often seen working at the airport) and 6 part-time or contracted employees.






