combination of District Designated Funds (DDF), cash, and/or directed gifts and endowment earnings to fund a global grant. The Foundation will provide an 80 percent World Fund match for all DDF contributions. There is no minimum World Fund match.



What is the Goal of Rotary Foundation Grants? (Part 1 of 2)

During the past 100 years, the Foundation has spent over \$3 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects. With your help, we can make lives better in your community and around the world. The Rotary Foundation impacts communities through our grants program, which offers four opportunities for funding. Let's look at the first two grant options:

District Grants – fund small-scale, short-term activities that address needs in your community and communities abroad. Each district chooses which activities it will fund with these grants. *How it works:* Districts may use up to 50 percent of their District Designated Fund, based on the amount of DDF generated from a District's Annual Fund giving three years prior, including Endowment Fund earnings.

Global Grants – fund large-scale international activities with sustainable and measurable results that support Rotary's areas of focus. Activities include humanitarian projects, scholarships and vocational training teams. *How it works:* Global grants have a minimum budget of \$30,000 and a maximum World Fund award of \$400,000. Grant sponsors can use a

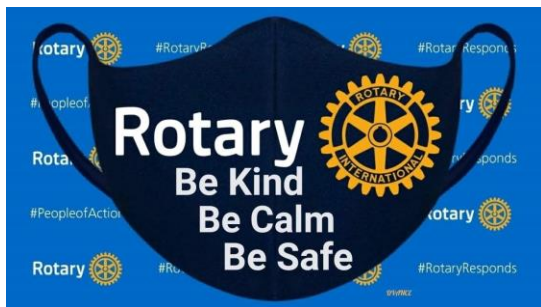

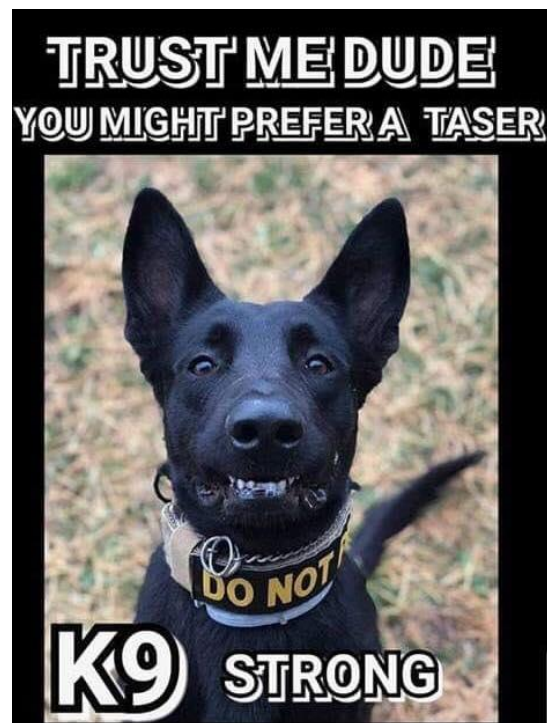

To the Rotary Club of Kelowna,

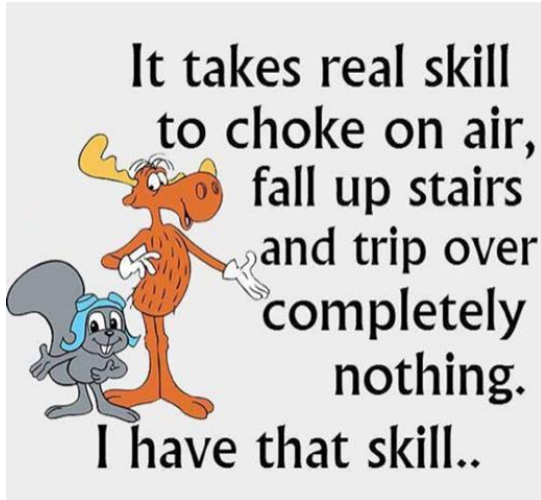

Our guest speakers this week were President Romany Runnals and Resource Team Leader Jamie Walsh from the Okanagan Humane Society. The Humane Society was established in 1996 with the goal of alleviating the problem of pet overpopulation where unwanted pets had been released into the wild and had spread throughout the area. Using volunteers and donations, the Humane Society rescued them, spayed, or neutered them and then housing them in volunteer foster homes for socialization and adoption. Through their efforts there are now virtually no stray dogs in the Central Okanagan and the wild cat population has been thinned dramatically. Their activities are ongoing with even more animal types and as a registered charity, they welcome donations.

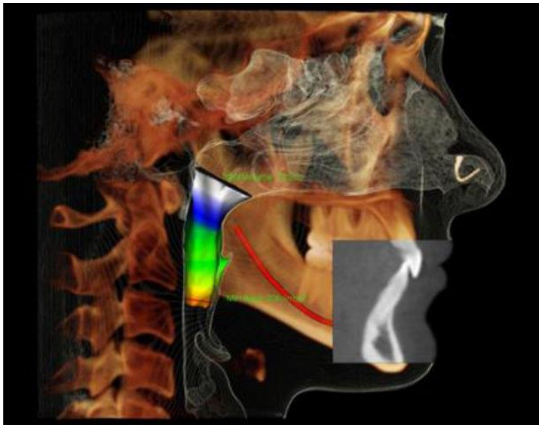
