

## **Rotary Day Planning Committee**

Friday February 21, 2025 meeting

We are organizing a Rotary kick of summer festival. We are not set on a name yet.

Date Saturday June 14, 2025

Event Location: We are set on Parkinson Rec Centre as the venue, offering both indoor and outdoor space for food and entertainment.

The city requires the event application at least 60 days prior, but our goal is to submit it 90 days prior giving us about one month to finalize it.

Clubs are donating between \$250.- and \$2000.-So far Rotary club of Kelowna (downtown club), Sunrise, Mission and the Capri club have confirmed their amount. Next step is asking for a matching grant. This means we spend the money first and get reimbursed later.

We had a member of the Peachland club, and he will discuss in his club if they are able to contribute. Committee members reached out for a stage, barbecues, and kid's games.

We have BBQ from the Sunrise club. The Strong Neighbourhood Block program might provide us with a free stage, sound equipment, and kids' games. President Eric from the Mission Club has a contact who rents bouncy castles and similar equipment. He will check availability for June 14 and whether any items can be donated.

BBQ Donations: Norm has been in discussions with Save-On-Foods, T bones and will ask Costco about the possibility of donating burgers, buns and condiments for the BBQ. He is also in contact with Montana's about sponsoring.

#### Crank giving event.

Bike event organized by Ogopogo club. Bikers get a map of the city with grocery stores they must visit to get a stamp. While in the store they can purchase food items and donate those to the foodbank. There will be prizes for most donated, best dressed etc. The participants will have visible Rotary Logo and number. The foodbank will come at the end of event to pick up the donated items.

• • Beer Garden: This may be back on the table, but we would look to outsource it to a local brewery, allowing them to handle licensing while possibly donating a portion of proceeds toward the event.


