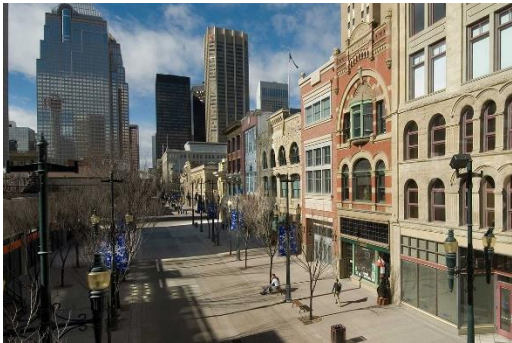

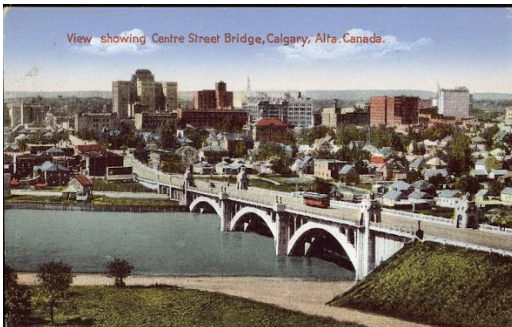

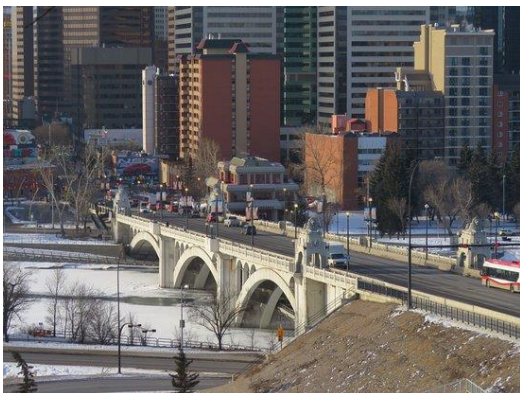
Calgary, circa 1900

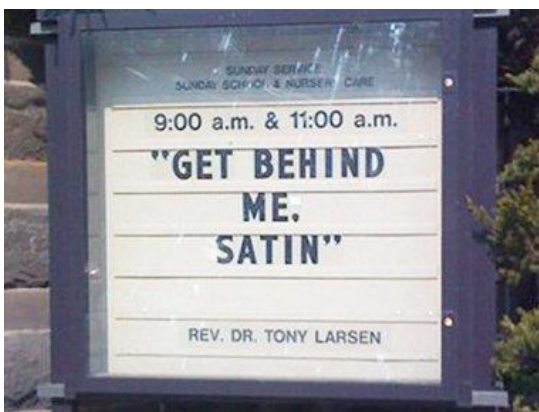
3. Will all agree that we got good benefit for their money or is it time to hit a fast food joint on the way home?

DG Sherry and Jim Chamberlain

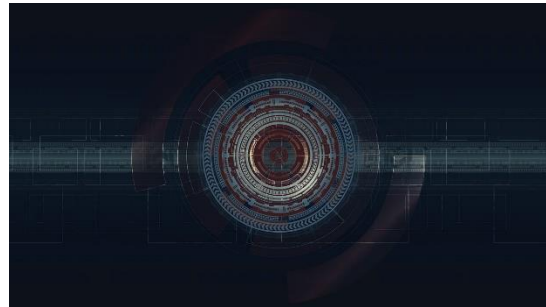

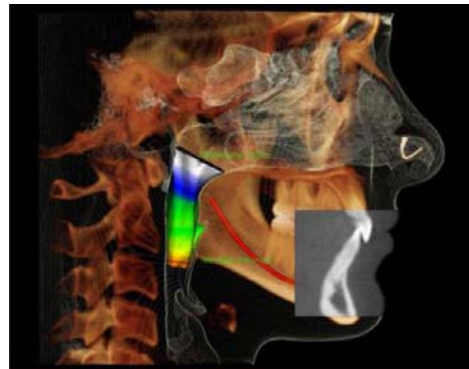

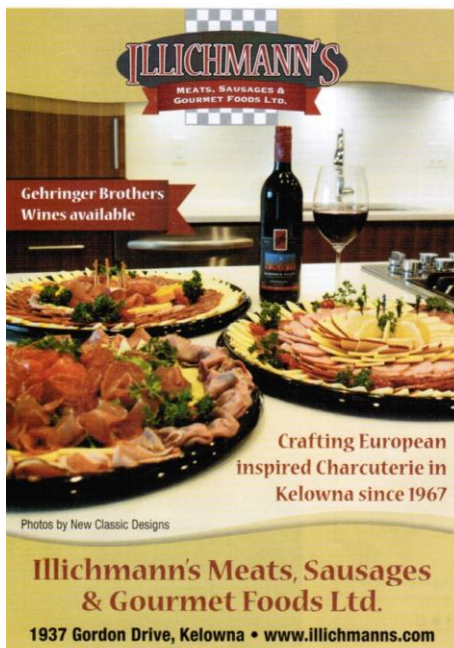
