## Thinking of going for a hike?

The need to be prepared for adverse weather conditions in Cape Scott Provincial Park cannot be overemphasized.

A good tent with a waterproof fly is imperative. It is simply not possible to expect to sleep outdoors here without adequate cover. Clothing, sleeping bags and food should be kept in waterproof bags. A small primus-type stove should be carried for cooking purposes since suitable firewood is in short supply. Moleskin is a good preventative against blisters. Proper raingear is a must, as torrential rains can be expected at any time and may last for days on end. A basic first aid kit should be carried, and insect repellent is recommended.






