Hello,

I hope you are all keeping well and have had a great summer so far. The Rotary Clubs of District 5060 have been so supportive of JoeAnna's House, so I just wanted to take a moment to provide a quick update on the project.

We're nearing the collective Rotary goal of \$250,000 in support of the project with over \$211,000 received in commitments to date. I am confident that with one last push over the next few months we'll be able to celebrate reaching that goal around the same time we welcome our first guests this December.

Rotary has been such a critical partner in this project and we will ensure we keep in touch. We will also be reaching out in the fall with opportunities for those who contributed to the District Matching Grant to aid in a work-day to set up the Peace Gardens, and also with invitations to tour the home once everything is up & running.

JoeAnna's House

The home is coming together quickly and beautifully. Attached are a few recent photos of the progress.

Over the past few months, the site has surpassed some significant milestones:

Outside – siding is installed, air conditioner units are in, wood soffits above entrances and windows are installed, and feature stonework is underway. Inside – hot water tanks are in, sprinkler piping and electrical wiring has been run, bathtub/shower surrounds are in & waterlines installed. ducting has been run, and drywall is going up all throughout the house.

The KGH Foundation

We just recently completed our audited financial statements for our fiscal year ending March 31st, 2019 and I wanted to take the opportunity to share a few highlights with you, so you can have complete confidence in the KGH Foundation to own, operate and fundraise for JoeAnna's House in the years to come.

The key indicators we focus on as an organization and an industry are the Cost To Raise a Dollar (CTRD) and Return on Investment (ROI). Our current CTRD is \$0.19 averaged over the last 3 fiscal years and our ROI, which represents the return on

each dollar spent and is an indicator of fundraising efficiency, is \$5.19. By comparison, the average ROI in Canada is \$4.18 and CTRD is \$0.24.

We're also very proud to have been recognized as an AHP (Association of Healthcare Philanthropy) high performer in two of the last three years. This honour is intended to highlight those organizations who are striving to raise the standards in the health care philanthropy industry and represents the top 25% in net production returns. We will also share a more detailed look at our financials with our annual Impact Report which will be distributed in September.
