


Service Above Self







GUEST SPEAKER

This evening's speaker was Corporal Michael Kube who spoke to us on RCMP operations within the Kelowna area. He began by covering the duties of the General Duty unit and then the functions of the Community Safety Unit. His unit, the Community Safety Unit is tasked with the requirement to increase the sense of safety in public spaces, to decrease the risk of property crime, to earn the trust of citizens who have experienced personal crime and to show the RCMP at its best for every citizen.

To meet this 24 hours a day/seven days a week tasking they have 27 officers (1 Staff Sergeant, 1 Sergeant, 3 Corporals and 22




