The Amarok Society, a non-profit agency, provides education to some of the poorest children on earth by teaching their mothers to become neighborhood teachers.

Why teach the mother? In their own words "On the basis of decades of practical success in disadvantaged communities in Canada and abroad, we have come to believe in the power of mothers to effect lasting improvements in their families and in their communities. Worldwide, there are over 70 million primary school-aged children unable to afford school. We believe that there will never be enough money to build schools for all of these children. Empowering their mothers to become their teachers is an innovative, effective way to address this long-standing problem. Our Mothers of Intention projects, undertaken with a local women's organization, educate mothers to educate their families and neighbourhoods.

If you teach a child, you teach a child. If you teach a father, he uses his new knowledge to gain a livelihood outside the home. But if you teach a mother, you teach a family."

Significant support for Amarok Society comes from Rotary Clubs. It has a formal relationship with the Rotary Club of Belleville, Ontario and with the Rotary Club of Dhaka Mid-Town, Bangladesh, and is supported by many other Rotary Clubs in North America and the United Kingdom.

In 2013, the Munros were awarded Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medals in recognition of the work of Amarok Society.
