The Sheriff started by talking about a little known Tomb of the Unknown Soldier which reportedly contains the remains of a headless man who ended up in a shallow grave near Garryowen, Montana likely during a retreat ordered by his commander, Major Reno. Two eagle buttons on his uniform were the only hints of his identity as a 7th Cavalry soldier.

Just a month shy of the battle's 50th anniversary, on May 26, 1926, road crews unearthed the remains while excavating a county road.

On June 26, 1926 an army ambulance carrying the flag-draped coffin, following a riderless horse, carried the unknown soldier's body from the a funeral at Crow Agency six miles to Garryowen. After Chaplain McMurry's eulogy, pallbearers lowered the coffin as the trumpeter played taps. In 1995, the museum placed a marble slab over the tomb with an engraving that reads, "Here Rests In Honored Glory An American Soldier Known But To God."
