Facing the Future – a suggested name for Jack's meeting every Tuesday morning at Staples, 9-11:30 am. A better name is being sought.

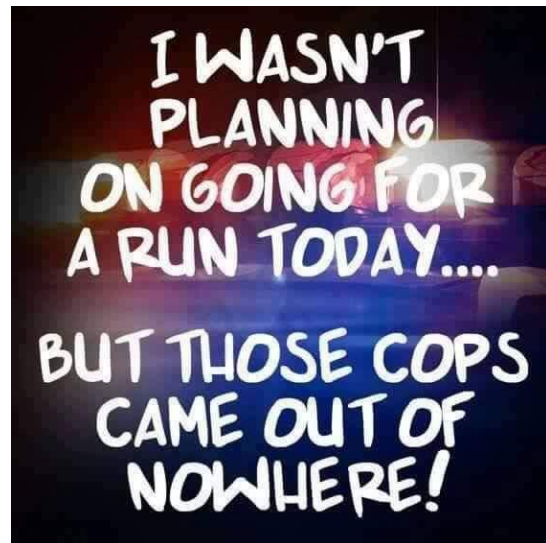
RC Yakima Celebrates its 100th

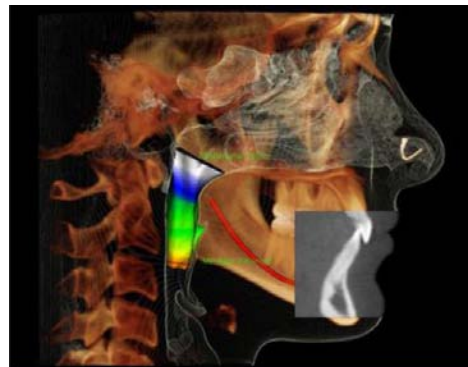


