

Our guest speaker this evening was Gordon Lovegrove who dropped by to talk about a topic dear to his heart, a tram-train that runs on hydrogen. Why hydrogen? Because hydrogen is already in development and it's environmentally friendlier than petrochemicals. Gordon envisions a hydrogen tram-train network that begins in the cities of the Okanagan Valley and eventually interconnect from the CN rail link through Kamloops to Amtrac in Washington.
